Goals

- Shift to a commissioning program that will function as an artists incubator - creating multiple career pathways for artists to grow
- Facilitate ways for APICC to build community with and between artists
- Allow APICC flexibility to address production and professional development needs of artists
- Implement ways Artistic Director can be more directly involved in the artistic creation process
