Treasure Island Arts Master Plan Report:

The Arts Commission and Treasure Island Development Authority (TIDA) have executed an intergovernmental agreement that reflects TIDA's commitment to a public art allocation of approximately \$50,000,000 to be funded through private development fees on Treasure Island over the next twenty years. The agreement stipulates that the \$50,000,000 shall be deposited into the Treasure Island Public Art fund to be supervised and expended by the Arts Commission with the approval of TIDA. The IGA further requires the Arts Commission's development of an Arts Master Plan which must be completed within one year in order to be synchronized with the design of the island's parks, open spaces and streetscapes. Public art is defined broadly to encompass permanent and temporary work in various mediums.

Staff has commenced preliminary work on the Arts Master Plan by conducting research regarding the history of Treasure Island and other island based art programs or programs located adjacent to shorelines and bridges and meeting regularly with the TIDA Executive Director and the multiple design teams. At the VAC meeting, recommendations regarding preliminary objectives, initial Art Activation Project ideas, methodology for research, and plans for public outreach will be discussed for Commissioners' comments.
