## ★ Ranked-Choice Voting



San Francisco voters elect members of the Board of Supervisors using ranked-choice voting. On the ballot, the names of all candidates for ranked-choice offices are listed in three repeating columns.

When voting, mark your first-, second-, and third-choice candidates for each ranked-choice office. To rank fewer than three candidates, or if there are fewer than three candidates listed for an office, mark your first choice (and second, if applicable), and leave any remaining columns blank.
