Japanese Community Youth Council	Mayor's Youth Employment and Education Program (MYEEP)	MYEEP provides San Francisco youth between the ages of 14-17 with the opportunity to build work experience through after school and summer employment at nonprofit and public sector organizations. MYEEP also helps participants develop job search skills, explore postsecondary education and various career opportunities, and learn numerous life skills.

Japanese Community Youth Council	San Francisco YouthWorks	San Francisco YouthWorks is a unique high school internship program that teaches young people crucial job skills while sparking their interest in public service careers. Architectural Foundation of San Francisco	Build San Francisco	The Architectural Foundation of San Francisco manages the Build San Francisco, an academic/mentorship program in partnership with the San Francisco Unified School District. AFSF will concentrate on Downtown, Ida B. Wells, and Independence High Schools in morning, and John O'Connell in the afternoon, 5 days a week during the academic day.
Jewish Vocational Service (JVS)	School Partner Model	The School Partner Program will establish training and career exploration activities, paid work experiences, workbased academic enrichment supports and cohort programming for 25 Downtown High School students who have poor attendance, have not passed the CHASEE or have low basic skills levels.
YMCA - Buchanan	Heat of the Kitchen - Fiscal Sponsor by the Buchanan YMCA	Heat of the Kitchen works with more than 100 students per year in 1 hr weekday classes within Ida B. Wells High School. Students develop core habits of work while enjoying the acts of cooking, eating and cleaning together. Out of these 100 students, 40 are placed into short term, paid job shadows and internships in hospitality related businesses.
Youth Treatment and Education Center	Career Pathways ~ Building 21st century skills and competencies for success	YTEC is a high expectation, high support, integrated intervention, steeped in a youth development framework. Our model features work-based learning experiences that foster academic and career success. The Career Pathways program will integrate these and those of the Big Picture Learning model, to be implemented at Principals' Collaborative HS.

Bay Area Community Resources	Youthline IT/Digital Media Work Experience	CHALK is an San Francisco based youth led project providing a range of youth services with a specific focus on transformative youth development and employment. CHALK targets youth with high risk characteristics for employment, placing them on the front lines as service providers for their peers. CHALK provides the youth with training and support.

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California Academy of Sciences	Careers in Science Intern Program	The Careers in Science Intern Program runs year-round and targets high school students from underserved communities in San Francisco. Interns learn job skills, prepare for college, and explore science careers in a paid work environment. Interns work with scientists, learn science, and teach science to the public, among other activities.
California Lawyers for the Arts	Spotlight on the Arts Youth Employment Project	Through Spotlight on the Arts, C.L.A. provides paid summer internships at arts organizations and enrichment workshops for six-eight weeks and continuing paid internships for summer graduates at arts organizations and enrichment workshops for San Francisco youth ages 14 to 17.
Enterprise for High School Students	Pathways	Pathways, a year round program, is designed to equip high school youth with the skills, knowledge and abilities to realize their current and future potential via a 3 phase program: 1)job readiness training, skills based workshops, and individual counseling sessions; 2)college/career counseling/workshops; 3)work based learning and job opportunities.
GirlSource	TLP Y-lead 3	GirlSource's Technology and Leadership Program (TLP) provides technology, job readiness, and life management skills to low-income young women ages of 14 and 18 from all over the city.
Hearing and Speech Center of Northern California	Transition Program for Youth with Hearing Loss	The Transition Program for Youth ages 12-17 who are Deaf or Hard-of-Hearing is a city-wide program that focuses on transition curriculum preparing youth for post-secondary education, employment and independent living. The TP collaborates with the SFUSD offering both individual and group services ranging from weekly to bi-monthly.
Huckleberry Youth Programs	Wellness Academy - San Francisco	Huckleberry's Wellness Academy provides low-income teens who are first-generation college bound with a four-year comprehensive health career training program including health education, academic case management, career exploration, internships, job-readiness skills, job placement assistance, academic tutoring, guidance counseling, and more.
Jewish Vocational Service (JVS)	Work Resource Program (WRP)	Work Resource Program provides youth with disabilities comprehensive job search skills, job readiness, and career exploration training at up to 20 SFUSD high schools, year-round job placement and retention services, along with access to post-secondary education counseling and referrals to appropriate transition and support services.
Juma Ventures	Pathways to Advancement - Youth Workforce Development for Educational Success	Pathways to Advancement prepares youth for successful transition to college through education and career counseling, tutoring, working with staff to create individual development and college/career transition plans, summer job training and placement, promoting financial literacy and Individual Development Accounts.
Lavender Youth Recreation and Information Center	Queer Youth Training Collaborative (QYTC)	The QYTC program supports primarily low-income LGBTQ youth of color to be ready to learn and succeed in school through a holistic set of activities--work experience, job readiness trainings, case management--that prepare youth with the knowledge, skills, and opportunities to make progress toward reaching their education and career goals.
Marriott Foundation for People w Disabilities	Bridges from school to work	Bridges from school to work is a workforce development program serving youth with special needs and multiple barriers to employment. Bridges provides comprehensive pre-employment, placement, and retention services for up to 24 months. Hours of operation are Monday - Friday, 9:00 a.m. - 5:00 p.m.

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Mission Neighborhood Centers	DPW La Tierra Summer 2010 Job Collaboration	DPW La Tierra Youth Young Adult Employment Program is a 5 week summer Clean/Green Workforce Development Training program; 120 participants, ages 16-25. The field assignments will consist of the following: debris/ litter removal, light landscaping and graffiti abatement @ DPW. Program hours are from 9am-3pm, Tues-Fri 2 Saturdays from 9am-12noon.
Richmond District Neighborhood Center	Youth Employment and Multicultural Leadership Program	The Youth Employment and Leadership programs of RDNC are based at the Richmond Village Beacon located on the campus of George Washington High school. They include on the job training and placement, job recruitment (job bank and job fairs), one on one resume and interview support, and job readiness workshops. Hours are during lunch and from 3-6pm.
Sunset District Community Development	UpStar Records (a project of Sunset Youth Services)	This program's primary goal is to expand youth employment and hands-on career training opportunities through UpStar Records, Sunset Youth Services youth-run record label. UpStar Records has Crew Member positions in recording, mixing, beat production, video, and social media. Upstar Records runs mon-fri, and is an annual rotation of opportunities.
United Way of the Bay Area	MatchBridge	MatchBridge helps young people build their foundation for educational and career success by preparing them for and placing them in jobs with business employers. Matchbridge offers an entry point for businesses seeking to engage with the City's myriad youth employment programs. Youth 16-21 y/o, who live or go to school in SF, are eligible.

Bay Area Community Resources	ReSET - Work Experience for High Risk Youth	ReSET: Re-defining Sustainable Employment and Training is a job training and work experience program for in-risk youth and young adults on probation. Participants receive 40-60 hours of job and life skills training, as well as academic support, mentoring and advocacy. Participants are placed at worksites, working a minimum of 10 hours a week.
Center for Young Women's Development	Sisters Rising Employment & Training Program	The Sisters Rising Training and Employment Program addresses the critical need among at risk young women to have legal employment and make a living wage, while learning transferable job skills that will allow them to transition into sustainable employment and successfully complete their conditions of probation.
Community Youth Center of San Francisco (CYC)	Generating Leadership Opportunities in the Workforce (GLOW) Employment Program	CYC's Generating Leadership Opportunities in the Workforce (GLOW) Employment Program works towards uplifting & motivating youth ages 14-21 involved with the Juvenile Justice system. GLOW will provide youth with proper tools to navigate through the workforce and to raise awareness about employment opportunities for a healthier future and lifestyle.
Delancey Street Foundation	Life Learning Academy (YWD-High Risk)	Life Learning Academy (LLA) located on Treasure Island is a SFUSD charter high school serving 62 students ages 14-18 involved or at-risk of involvement in the juvenile justice system and/or who have challenging life problems including school failure, family problems, poverty, abuse, gang involvement, and substance abuse.

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Horizons Unlimited of San Francisco, Inc.	LifeWorks	Horizons' LifeWorks Program is a youth workforce development program that provides job readiness, life skills, career exploration, academic support, and worksite placement for youth, ages of 14-20, currently on formal/informal probation. The program is offered year round: Summer (6 weeks, 20 hours per week) and Fall (30 weeks, 10 hours per week).
Hunters Point Family	Ujaama Employment & Entrepreneurship	The HPF Ujaama Employment & Entrepreneurship program serves high-risk youth ages 14 - 22 years who are residents of BVHP. The program prioritizes youth that have justice-system involvement. Ujaama is a work readiness and on-the-job training program within the agency's youth businesses. The program operates Monday - Friday, 11 am - 6 pm.
Larkin Street Youth Services	Future Track	The Future Track Program provides pre-employment services to homeless and runaway youth through early career exploration workshops at the Drop-In Center and The LOFT group home. Youth who participate in Future Track are linked with more intensive employment services, including day labor, job readiness, and technology training, through HIRE UP.
Larkin Street Youth Services	Youth Sector Bridge	The HIRE Up Youth Sector Bridge program provides homeless youth with a track toward post-secondary education and a training and employment placement program in green job skills such as weatherization.
New Door Ventures	ALLY Program Expansion	ALLY is an internship program which gives at-risk youth (ages 17-21) pre-employment training, paid work experience, educational support and intensive case management. Youth work in community partner sites, including for-profit and non-profit organizations. ALLY is a cohort model, offered 3-5 times per year, with days and hours varying by site.
Old Skool Cafe	Old Skool Cafe	Old Skool Cafe provides jobs and training to youth ages 16-22, focusing on the at-risk, previously incarcerated, and foster care population. Youth are employed in every aspect of the restaurant as chefs, waiters, and entertainment. Youth receive 12.5 hours of work experience each week.
Vietnamese Youth Development Center	SFYAW-San Francisco Young Adults Working Program	The VYDC SFYAW program provides low-income at risk youth and young adults between the ages of 16-24 with one-on-one supportive services, employment readiness skills, referrals and placements at jobs and internships. The program runs in two cycles one in the fall and spring.
Youth Guidance Center Improvement Committee	In-Risk Youth - Recruitment through JPD	In-Risk Youth Employment Recruitment (JPD). We coordinate job referral and follow-up of probationary youth from 14 to 18 years old. We assist in the acquisition of work documents, the application process, provide assessment and pre-employment training, then refer youth for a job. We support youth referred and communicate with all stake holders.
