

MARIJUANA OFFENSES OVERSICHT (OMMITTEE INCIDENT REPORT FORM

HAVE YOU HAD AN ENCOUNTER WITH SAN FRANCISCO POLICE OR SHERIFFS INVOLVING MARIJUANA?

If San Francisco police or sheriffs have arrested, cited or approached you about a marijuana offense that you believe should be considered a lowest law enforcement priority, the Marijuana Offenses Oversight Committee has a community complaint form you can fill out.

Marijuana offenses by adults in San Francisco are the lowest law enforcement priority, which means that San Francisco police and sheriffs are to treat all other crimes as a priority over adult marijuana offenses. The San Francisco Board of Supervisors passed an ordinance in November, 2006 making marijuana offenses the lowest law enforcement priority.

San Francisco has created a committee -- the Marijuana Offenses Oversight Committee -- to gather statistics, take community complaints, and find out if police and sheriffs are treating marijuana offenses as the lowest law enforcement priority.

There are some situations where marijuana offenses are *not* considered a lowest law enforcement priority. These are:

- Anyone under 18 involved with a marijuana offense.
- Giving or selling marijuana to minors under 18.
- Giving or selling marijuana to adults on public property, including public streets, sidewalks, parks, buildings, or other public property.
- Giving or selling marijuana to adults in view of people on public property, unless this takes place entirely inside someone's home or inside a private building.
- Driving while under the influence of marijuana.
- Any acts of violence or threats of violence that are related to, or take place along with, the marijuana offense.
- When police or sheriffs believe the marijuana offense can cause serious physical harm to the public.
