B. INVESTIGATION SURVEYS

Subcommittee Chair Kimura 15 min

The Subcommittee discussed investigation surveys and if it made sense to continue using surveys for complaints alleging violations of Standard 1 of the Standards of Care. Members Kahn and Hall stated that they did not think surveys were useful for Standard 1 investigations unless a large number of clients in the same demographic group all reported having the same problems with shelter staff. Member Hall stated that she would like to see surveys include questions about clients' civil rights, constitutional rights and potential Title VI violations. The Subcommittee agreed to review existing site visit surveys and to come to the next Subcommittee meeting with ideas for a new survey format and survey questions.
