**C. Standard of Care and Staff Report Committee Staff** *10 min* Committee staff reviewed the August 2015, Standard of Care and Staff report.

**Committee comment:** Member Mukami brought up the idea of requesting training records for front-line shelter staff and shelter managers. Member Mukami also brought up the idea of working with the Human Rights Commission and HOPE in cases where clients allege that staff are violating Standard 1.

**Committee comment:** Member Morimoto discussed difficulties the Committee has had in the past of investigating violations of Standard 1 and the flaws in the previous system of surveying all clients after receiving a complaint about staff. Member Morimoto also discussed how the Committee is now tracking the names of shelter staff that are frequently named in complaints in order to identify specific employees that have a history of disrespectful or abusive behavior.

**Committee comment:** Member Sul Rama brought up the point that the Shelter Training Manual has not been updated since 2004.

**Committee comment:** Member Steen discussed the possibility of seeing if the Human Rights Commission has any cases that they are overseeing that have also been reported to the Shelter Monitoring Committee.

**Public comment:** Cynthia Lee gave her opinion that shelter staff do not take it seriously when clients are threatening other clients with physical violence.
