b. Discussion and Debrief of June 5, 2023 full Youth Commission meetings.

Chair Nguyen read out the agenda from the last YC meeting. Vice Chair Barker Plummer thought the presentation went well and wonders when the gun violence resolution is being introduced at the full Youth Commission. Director Garcia said that Commissioner Hillman needs to be at the meeting to introduce the resolution. Commissioner Listana wants to post the Banko Brown statement since this issue is still relevant.

Director Garcia will be sending the HSH strategic plan to HRT and HRT will listen to the recording of the HRT meeting to make a document of the question. Commissioners continue the discussion.

  - a. Review Commission Attendance

Director Garcia brings up that she doesn't know when the bylaws working group will convene, but there needs to be a serious conversation around attendance policies. Commissioners say that it should be an agendized item for Exec next meeting since the bylaws working group usually is exec members. Director Garcia and the Commissioners have a discussion about how the attendance policy should change or explore changing. Overall, attendance is fine for now.

- b. Updates on Commission Outreach and Communications
  - Presenters: Gabrielle Listana & Astrid Utting, Communication and Outreach Officers

Officer Listana will make a document of the executive committee roles for transitioning. Officer Listana gives the report.

- c. Updates on Recent Youth-Related Board of Supervisors/Mayor Legislation
  - Presenters: Steven Hum & Raven Shaw, Legislative Affairs Officers

No new BOS legislations, but Office Hum emphasizes public commenting at BOS and Committee meetings. He is asking for what's the main policy points of the



Youth Commission. CEEC talked about prioritizing school safety and investing in violence prevention CBOs. Staff Zhan brought up that the Youth Commission should understand what the pulse on the ground is so that the Commission can advocate for the letters of support that it wrote and work with the CBOs. Chair Nguyen and Vice Chair Barker Plummer should meet with staff to hash this out. HRT will focus on vision zero, but not sure where the most effective since the MTA isn't presenting to the BOS. Additionally, the SF LGBT Center asked the Youth Commission to help with the TAY Housing funding advocacy. TJ will focus on Juvenile Hall, the Narcan program, and increasing funding to JJC and DPH. The LGBTQ+ Task Force will focus on LYRIC funding.

#### d. Summer Planning and Transitions

Planning the end-of-year event, and it'll happen sometime in late July. Chair Nguyen envisions that it'll be a reflection on the year, the Chairs of each committee will speak, and other groups come and speak about partnerships. Snacks and food will be available. This event needs to happen on-site since budget-wise, this will not be approved. The Mayor's office does want to do something for the Youth Commission as well.

#### e. Approval of Full YC June 17, 2023 Agenda

Vice Chair Barker Plummer reads out the legislations that should be on the agenda: the TAY LGBTQ shelter/supportive housing resolution, the motion to support ACA 5, the Tenderloin restroom letter of support, the Geary improvement project letter of support, bikes on MUNI resolution, school safety resolution, gun control resolution. Director Garcia will ask for the gun control resolution to be moved to the next meeting. Officer Hum is adding the mental health and vote16 resolutions and will submit them for June 20th CEEC agenda as well. Chair Nguyen will have another bike resolution for the July meeting. The Transformative Justice Committee will work through everything by the July 17th meeting. Director Garcia reads back the agenda for 6/26. Discussion on what can be moved by July. Staff Zhan suggests moving the HSH strategic plan.

Moved by Officer Hum, seconded by Chair Nguyen, to approve the agenda with amendments. Director Garcia mentions that there's a limited amount of meeting rooms in City Hall for that day. No public comment. The motion carried by voice vote:
