2	Resolution urging the Mayor and the Board of Supervisors to officially support and formally
3	commend President Obama's Summer Jobs+ plan and to develop a similar plan for the youth
4	of San Francisco.

6	WHEREAS, President Obama announced a new plan, Summer Jobs+, to address the critical
7	need for youth employment in the United States; and
8	WHEREAS, This initiative is a public private partnership committed to creating 180,000 jobs
9	and internships for low-income youth ages 16-24 in the summer of 2012 (with the goal of 250,000),
10	and
11	WHEREAS, The majority of San Francisco's youth want a job during the summer, 1 and
12	WHEREAS, 91% of San Francisco's young people want a job either during the school year,
13	summer, or year-round, ² and
14	WHEREAS, The central feature of this plan is the Summer+ Job Bank, which will have youth
15	employment listings similar to the Veterans Job Bank; and
16	WHEREAS, Summer jobs have historically been an opportunity for youth to develop crucial job
17	skills, earn money for college, and provide a responsible and rewarding pastime when school is not in
18	session; and
19	WHEREAS, Only 48.8% of youth this July were employed, the lowest July record since the
20	Bureau of Labor Statistics began this record in 1948; ³ and

1	WHEREAS, These July employment figures have dropped significantly from 59.2% five years
2	ago and 63.3% ten years ago; and
3	WHEREAS, Youth summer unemployment disproportionately affects minority youth, with just
4	34.6% of African American and 42.9% of Hispanic youth working this July; and
5	WHEREAS, All things being equal, a year spent unemployed under the age of 23 will reduce a
6	young man's earnings even 10 years later by 23%, and a young woman's by 16%; ⁴ and
7	WHEREAS, Some research has pointed to unemployed youth being more likely to use drugs or
8	commit property crimes; now, therefore, be it
9	RESOLVED, That the Youth Commission urges the Mayor and the Board of Supervisors to
10	officially support and formally commend President Obama's Summer Jobs+ plan and to develop a
11	similar plan calling on businesses to commit to hiring, mentoring, or training San Francisco youth—
12	particularly in the Transitional Aged Youth population of 16-24 year-olds with barriers to employment—
13	so as to spark a strong work ethic in San Francisco's young people, while setting up the city and
14	county for a successful future.
