2	Resolution Urging the Board of Supervisors and the Mayor to support the Middle Class
3	Scholarship Act proposed by Speaker John A. Perez of the California State Assembly.

5	WHEREAS, Students from middle class families are often overlooked, and have great difficulty
6	paying for college; and
7	WHEREAS, Students from higher income families can often afford to cover the tuition and fees
8	for colleges, while students from lower income families can qualify for more financial aid and grants;
9	and
10	WHEREAS, Many middle class students rely on student loans to pay for their tuition, and many
11	of them finish school in debt; and
12	WHEREAS, Some middle class students cannot afford to pay for college, and eventually give
13	up on obtaining a higher education; and
14	WHEREAS, The Middle Class Scholarship Plan will allow students from middle class families
15	to attend a University of California (UC), California State University (CSU), or Community College at a
16	lower cost, ensuring that their families can save more money; and
17	WHEREAS, Under the Middle Class Scholarship Act, tuition and fees for college would be cut
18	down by two-thirds for middle class students in the UC and CSU system; and
19	WHEREAS, The Middle Class Scholarship Act would save UC students about \$8,200 a year
20	and CSU students about \$4,000 a year; ¹ and
21	WHEREAS, \$150 million would be set aside for Community Colleges to make it more
22	affordable; and
