SUPPORTIVE TRANSITIONAL HOUSING FOR JUSTICE INVOLVED ADULTS

Creating effective pathways out of the justice system is a critical element to address social inequities. In partnership with the Tenderloin Housing Clinic, the San Francisco Adult Probation Department created a new housing program called New Horizons. This program has demonstrated its efficacy in bridging substance use treatment and behavioral health services to effectively help clients regain their place in our community and obtain permanent housing.

- Reduce recidivism
- Permanent housing

Program Components:

- 12 months of transitional housing
- Clinical/Reentry case management
- Permanent housing placement services
- Banking/Savings program
