DESIGN CONCEPT

The proposed Dogpatch Arts Plaza would convert the dead-end portion of 19th Street (west of Indiana Street) into an 8,000-sf arts-focused public pedestrian plaza. Inspired by the popular Decompression Festival held on Indiana Street each year, the plaza would combine Burning Man's artistic spirit with the Dogpatch's industrial heritage to create an "outdoor gallery" for large-scale and industrial art. Dogpatch Arts Plaza would combine the ideas of pocket plaza and outdoor gallery to create a "third place" where neighbors and passers-by can come together to engage with art and with each other.
