Native American Arts & Cultural Traditions grants support a broad range of cultural traditions and contemporary artistic forms practiced by Native American artists and communities. Selected projects are guided by strong and capable *Native American leadership*.

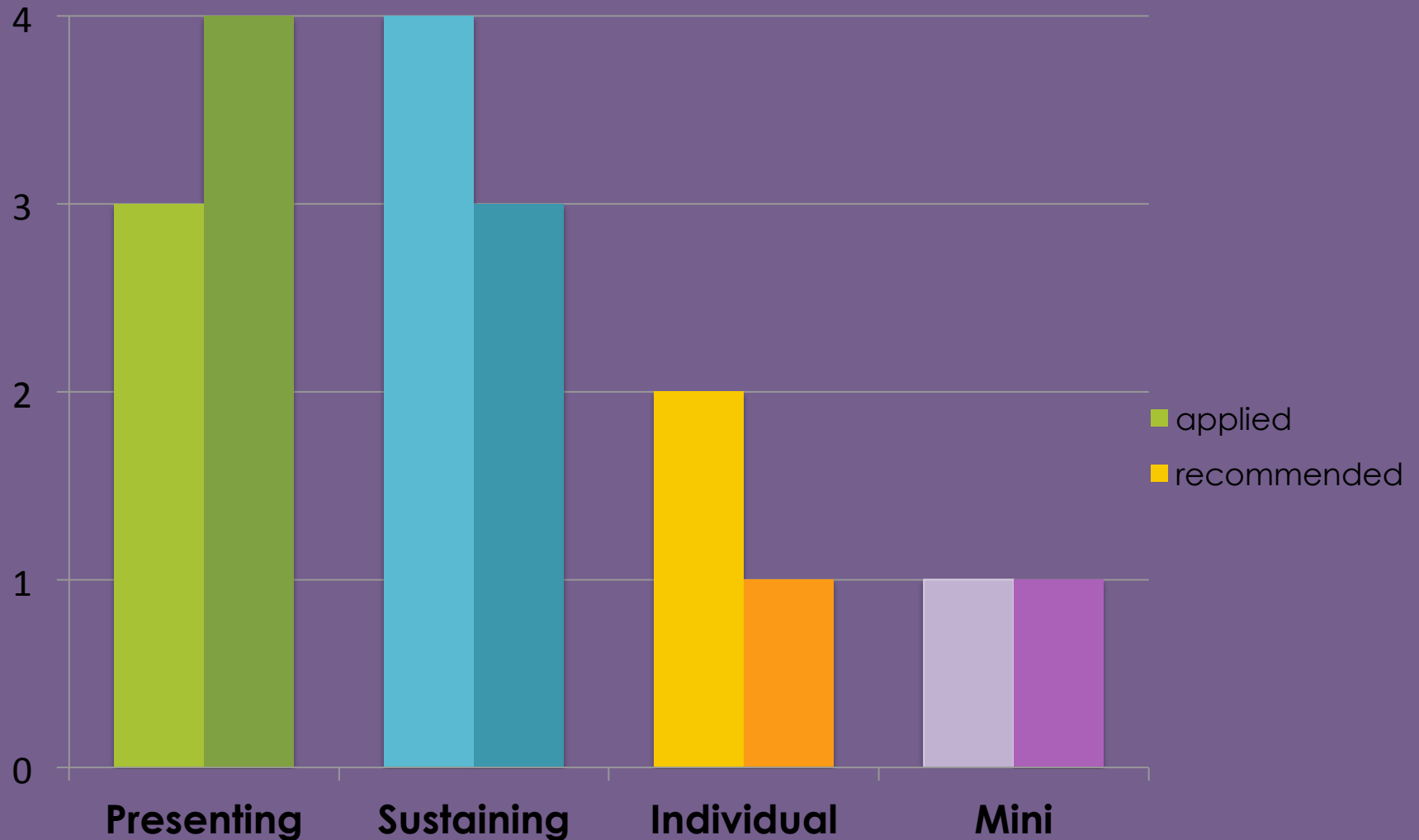
Projects are assessed based on artistic quality or quality of the planned activities, project merit and clarity, public benefit and impact on the audience, and ability to carry out the project.

Applicants may submit proposals in four categories:

- **Presenting the Art** (up to \$7,500)
Supports culturally knowledgeable presenting of artistic work and cultural traditions to the public
- **Building Sustainable Arts** (up to \$15,000)
Seeds or strengthens services or support structures for multiple artists to build the long term capacity of the Native American artistic community
- **Individual Artists** (up to \$7,500)
Supports the development and presentation of new work by Native American artists working in traditional and/or contemporary forms
- **Mini Grants** (up to \$1000)
Supports arts, culture or educational events or activities in the Native American community



*one applicant to the Building Sustainable Arts category was recommended to be funded under Presenting the Arts for the artistic portion of their project

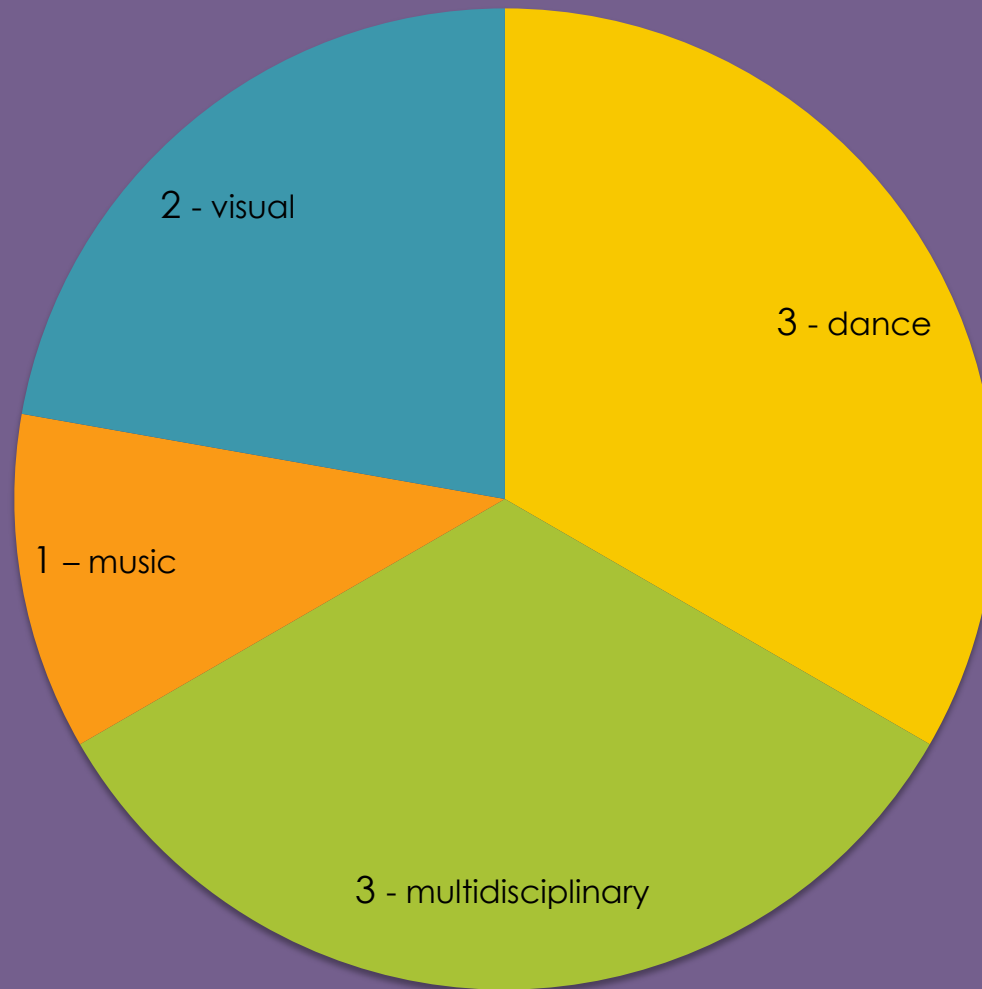

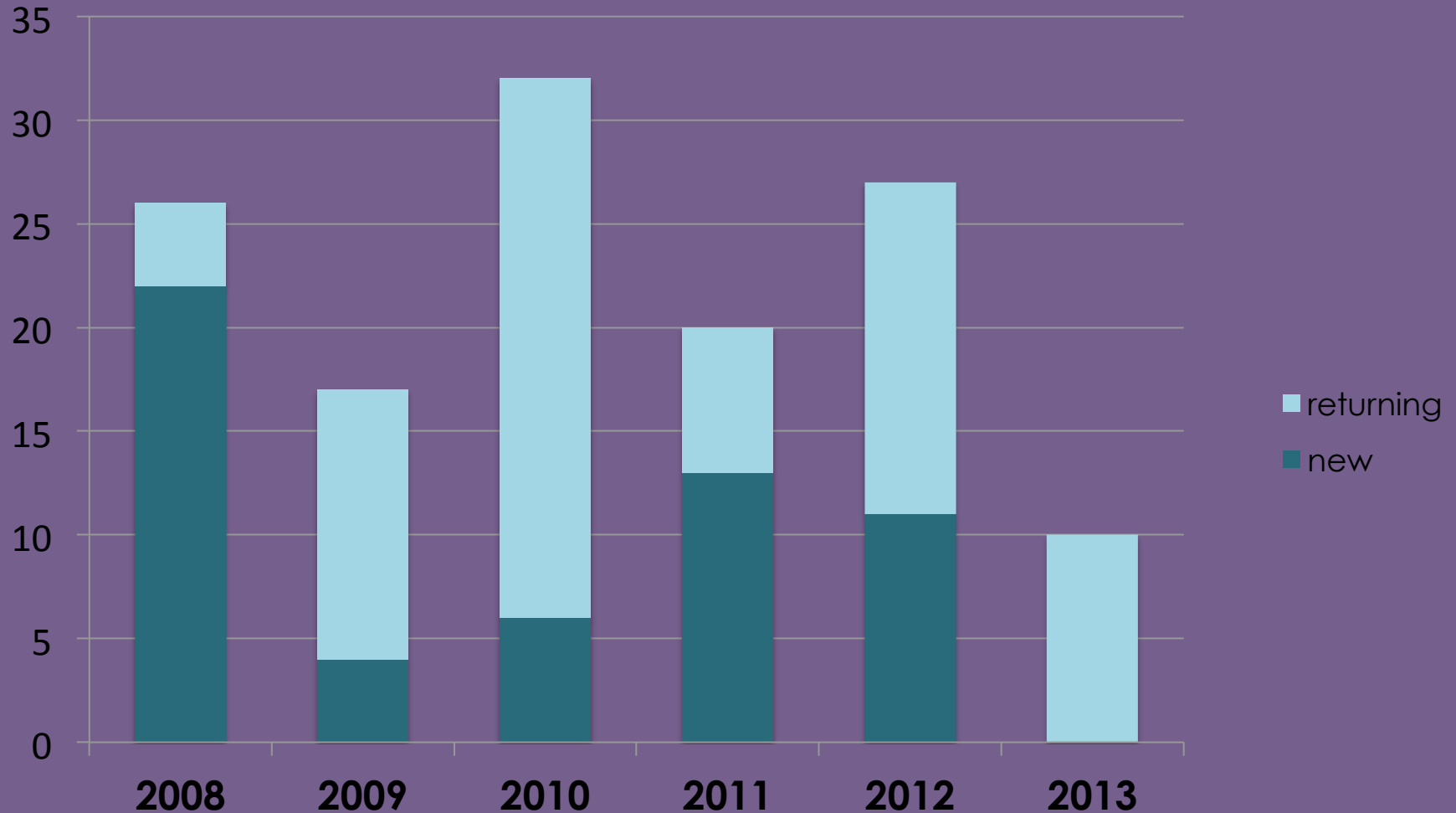
