STAC Cultural Equity Grants FY13 Organization Project Grants

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Organization Project Grants support the presentation of professional arts activities accessible to the San Francisco public.

Projects are assessed based on artistic quality, impact on the organization, soundness of the plan, impact on the target audience, and organizational capacity.

Grants can be up to \$15,000 (although the maximum eligible request may be smaller for small budget size organizations).

The OPG category has our largest and broadest applicant pool—and is typically our most competitive grant program. Organizations must sit out from the category for a year if they have received 3 consecutive OPGs.








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Organization Budget Size




Project Discipline







Why weren't some applicants funded? Areas that applicants may need to strengthen include:

- Clarity of curatorial or artistic vision
- Strength and clarity of work samples
- Relevance of the project at this time; Why this project? Why now?
- Clear link between artistic components and community impact
- Overall clarity of project plans (well defined and realistic timeline, clear concepts, etc.)
- Clear understanding of audience and community
- Organizational position: Realistic budget, stable financial picture and strong leadership
