Project Summary

This initiative will elevate Native communities' creative media expressions and honor their cultural sovereignty. It will raise the voices of the Native American community in the Bay Area through an integrated media initiative, while raising the organizational capacity of The Cultural Conservancy. In alignment with TCC's 2013-2017 strategic plan, the initiative includes design and delivery of community-based cultural media trainings; expansion of TCC's production projects; creation of publicly-accessible cultural media archives; and organizational development activities.

Chinese Culture Foundation of San Francisco

Project Summary

This proposal requests \$100,000 over two year to implement our recently revised strategic plan by hiring a full time Deputy Director. The DD will enhance the CCF's long-term sustainability by strengthening the infrastructure of the organization and allow the Executive Director (ED) significant additional time to pursue CCF's development priorities and strategic positioning.

Women's Audio Mission

Project Summary

Women's Audio Mission is seeking funding to implement the core strategies of a new 5 year capacity building plan that will allow WAM to meet the demand for training of an additional 300 women and girls a year, expand programs, strengthen WAM's development and staff infrastructure, greatly increase WAM's earned revenue and individual giving, and making the organization more self-sustaining. This initiative requires the expansion of existing staff positions and hiring a full-time Development Director.
