- Demonstrated feasibility of the preliminary proposal and the proposal budget
- Demonstrated maintainability and durability of the artwork's design, materials, fabrication and installation methods
- Result of reference checks

Motion: Motion to approve the panel's recommendation to not select any of the finalists' proposals for the Bayview Gateway Public Art Project as per Section 4.9, *Recourse*, of the *Policies and Guidelines for the Civic Art Collection of the City and County of San Francisco*. **Moved:** Imus/Brandon

Vote: Brandon, Imus, Moore, Watson – 4 Yey; Beltran, Buckley, Dodt, Fuentes Pritikin – 5 Nay

While there was not a majority vote for not selecting any of the finalists' proposals for the Bayview Gateway Public Art Project, the vote was very close and staff will convey the results of the panel and discuss possible next steps with Commissioners at the Visual Arts Committee meeting on September 17, 2014.
