RE: Item #5(1), Visual Arts Committee Reports, approval of base design and text for bust of Adolph Sutro

**Background**: The bust of Adolph Sutro for installation in City Hall is a gift of the United Humanitarian Mission. Jonah Hendrickson is the artist and the design of the full clay model of the bust was approved previously by the Commission. However, still outstanding is the approval of the design of the sculpture base and the text that is intended to be engraved on the base.

The donor has planned installation of the bust around the  $22^{nd}$  or  $23^{rd}$  of April, and has already sent out invitations to a reception on April  $29^{th}$ .

Staff has no issue with the design of the base, but needs more time to document the historical accuracy of the text. Staff also feels that the text would benefit from some editing for style.

**Recommendation**: In the interests of time, approve the design and material of the base (sample granite to be presented at meeting) and delegate approval of the final text on the base to the Director of Cultural Affairs.
