

Motion: Motion to approve Clay Jensen, artist, as a potential panelist for upcoming public art selection panels in Fiscal Year 2013/2014.

Clay Jensen has lived and worked in the San Francisco Bay Area for over thirty years. During this time his work has referenced the urban industrial environment while in a parallel contrast combining the vast spaces of the state of Utah where he was born and raised. He considers his work to be introspective and humanistic. As the landscape of the East Bay has changed and the end of the urban industrial era has ended, his work has also changed. Although steel fabrication, bronze casting and paint have been his primary mediums, Jensen has an extensive mixed media background, which he has been developing into his work as his environment has evolved. The vessel and landscape have currently become the main focus in his new pieces. Clay Jensen has exhibited his work in galleries and museums throughout the United States; he has numerous works in public and private collections. Jensen has taught sculpture at the University of California at Berkeley, San Jose State University, University of Montana and the University of Utah. Clay Jensen has been teaching sculpture at the California College of the Arts for the past twenty-five years.
