

Temporary Public Art Project Sponsored by the Hayes Valley Neighborhood Association

The Hayes Valley Neighborhood Association, long committed to the beautification of their community, has developed a pilot project to reduce trash on their merchant corridor in partnership with the SF Department of Public Works, Recology and local merchants and organizations including Absinthe Group, Fig and Thistle Bar, Souvla, Salt and Straw and the Friends of Linden Alley (a Living Alley). Using only private funds, the group will bring six Big Belly compacting trash cans to Hayes Valley which feature reproductions of original art from Hayes Valley artists as well as from students at the John Muir Elementary School in partnership with the Haight Street Art Center. The pilot program will have a duration of two years commencing in March 2019 through March 2021.

The following artists' work will be placed at the location indicated below (a representative sample of the art to be displayed is included as part of the Explanatory Documents for this project).

1. Earl Spea's BIRDS: Bus stop at Grove and Gough or near Absinthe's parklet on Hayes Street
2. Tana Quincy's FINE ART: North side of Patricia's Green on Hayes Street
3. Mikal Malkovich's Art (student from John Muir Elementary School) North side of Patricia's Green on Hayes Street
4. Jennifer Harris's CONFETTI: SW corner of Hayes at Octavia Street
5. Rhonel Roberts' CITY SCENE: NE corner of Hayes at Laguna Street
6. Sarah Young's CAT: NE or SE corner of Linden at Octavia Street

Motion to approve the temporary placement of artwork by Earl Spea, Tana Quincy, Jennifer Harris, Rhonel Roberts, Mikal Malkovich and Sarah Young on six Big Belly compacting trash containers in the Hayes Valley merchant corridor for a period of two years commencing March 2019 through March 2021 using only private funds at no cost to the City.
