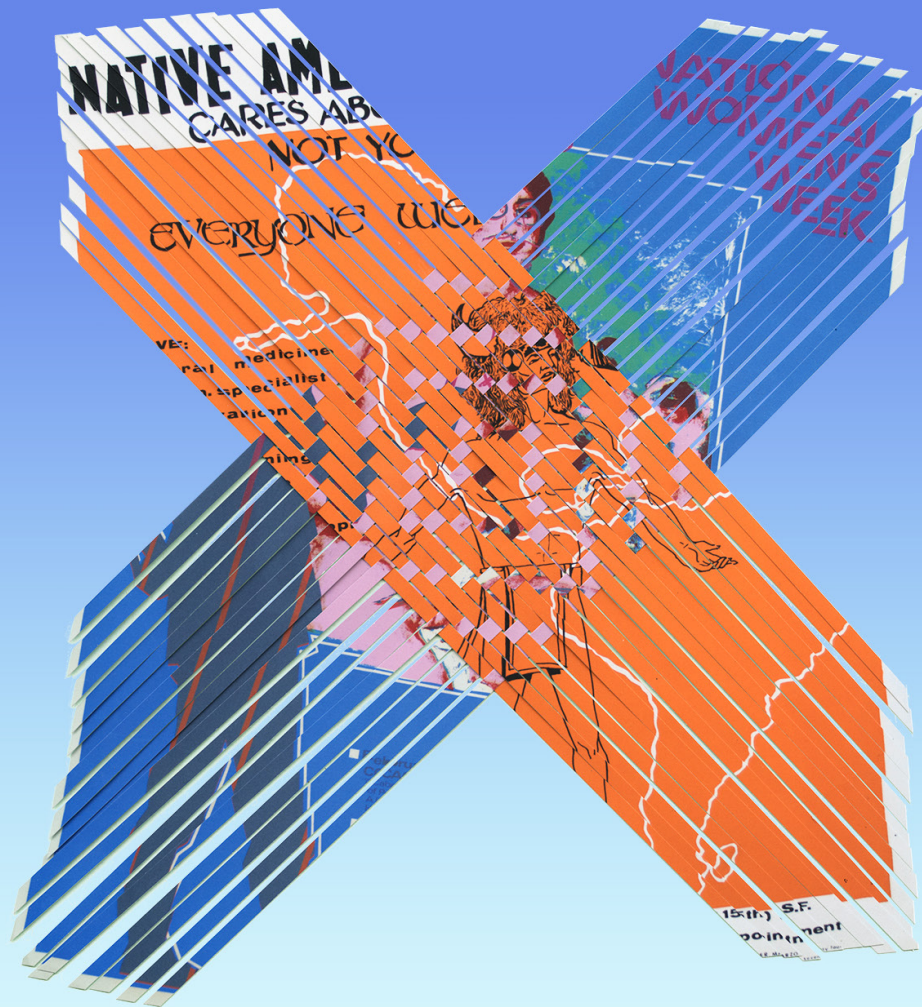
**ARTS COMMISSION APPROVAL**

But here, my dreams changed for other things; like to build a restaurant back home for my mother. I want to have money in my savings for old age. To be here, my dream is to return to my country, and see my people, my family. I have not seen my Mother since I was 9 years old.

I am person who does not give up and keeps pushing myself to do better. Where I am from the opportunity for advancement was not as frequent. In Honduras you either go to school or go to work. My mother was already here, and my great grandmother raised me. Going to school was becoming difficult, so one day my Mom called and said it was time to go. My great grandmother was also realizing that she would not be around long enough to take care of me. I did not want to leave my great grandmother, but sometimes you have to do something you don't want for your own good.

I eventually ended up in a refugee center trying to come to United States. It took me 53 days to get out that place and arrive in San Francisco. In that place, I forgot that men don't cry, in that place I cried almost everyday in private.
