



Project Summary

Build Public has partnered with **ArtSpan** to identify and install art in Dogpatch Arts Plaza. Build Public and ArtSpan are dedicated to bringing art to the plaza that reflects the community and neighborhood surrounding the development.

ArtSpan approached artist Laura Kimpton, of **She's Got Wings**, about displaying some of her monumental work in the plaza. This sculpture would be the first in a series showcased in the space, and would be in place for approximately one year.

Together, Build Public, ArtSpan, and She's Got Wings have collaborated to bring this proposal to the **San Francisco Arts Commission** to install the Centaur in Dogpatch Arts Plaza.







The Centaur

The Centaur was originally created as part of Celtic Forest, Kimpton's sculptural debut at Burning Man in 2007. Celtic Forest was an environment where the elements of nature, earth, wind, water and fire, literally and figuratively represented, are balanced with the human senses. Kimpton partnered with Antonio Ruperto to craft three sculptures of gods and goddesses representing the elements. The sculptures created are the Goddess of Air, Belissima; the Goddess of Water, the Mermaid Boann; and the God of the Earth, the Centaur. Each god was surrounded by steel moats with fire created with propane fire effects. Kimpton states "the sculptures are half-human animal and half-animal, symbolizing that we need to tune into the animal side of our nature. Humans are animals too." Kimpton and her crew won two honorarium grants from Burning Man for Celtic Forest.







Physical Specs

- The Centaur is created out of recycled steel toolboxes claimed from the dump in Petaluma, CA.
- Approximately 8' tall, 6' in diameter.
- Weighs approximately 400 lbs.



Installation

- The sculpture will be installed as soon as plaza construction is complete (late-July/early-August) and should take less than one day.
- The sculpture is stored in three parts, which allows for easy shipping and installation. The circular base of the piece is composed of steel and is designed to tether the sculpture to the foundation.
- The plaza has been designed with a 12'x18' reinforced cast-in-place concrete foundation specifically to support large scale installations such as this. The sculpture will be bolted directly into the concrete foundation with wedge anchors.



Operations & Maintenance

- The Centaur will be installed in August
 2017 for up to one year.
- Friends of Dogpatch Arts Plaza, the nonprofit plaza steward, will maintain insurance for the duration of the Centaur's display.
- Dogpatch Arts Plaza is a public rightof-way and is under the jurisdiction of Public Works. The project sponsor has been issued a Major Encroachment Permit that authorizes artwork to be installed in the plaza pending Arts Commission approval.
- Maintenance of the Centaur should be minimal; the artist will be available to aid in any necessary maintenance.





About the Artist

Laura Kimpton's work consists of painting, mixed-media installations and sculpture. Her creativity stems from a desire to question traditional views on social interaction, invoking through her art a reaction and discussion from her viewers that ultimately complete her projects. Kimpton is always exploring new mediums in her search for invigorating means of communication. Kimpton lives in Fairfax, California.







Other Work

Kimpton is the conceptual force behind the Monumental Word Series that began at Burning Man in 2009. Jeff Schomberg has collaborated with Laura in building and installing her revolutionary conceptual designs. Viewers are encouraged to interact with each sculpture on their own terms. These sculptures often evoke varied emotions and interpretations, and can mean different things to different people.

Kimpton's sculptures have been purchased by civic municipalities and private collectors across the United States, as well as internationally in Puerto Rico and China. Articles on and images of Kimpton's work have been featured in Rolling Stone, Huffington Post, the Press Democrat, Town and Country, SF Magazine and Inc, to name a few.
