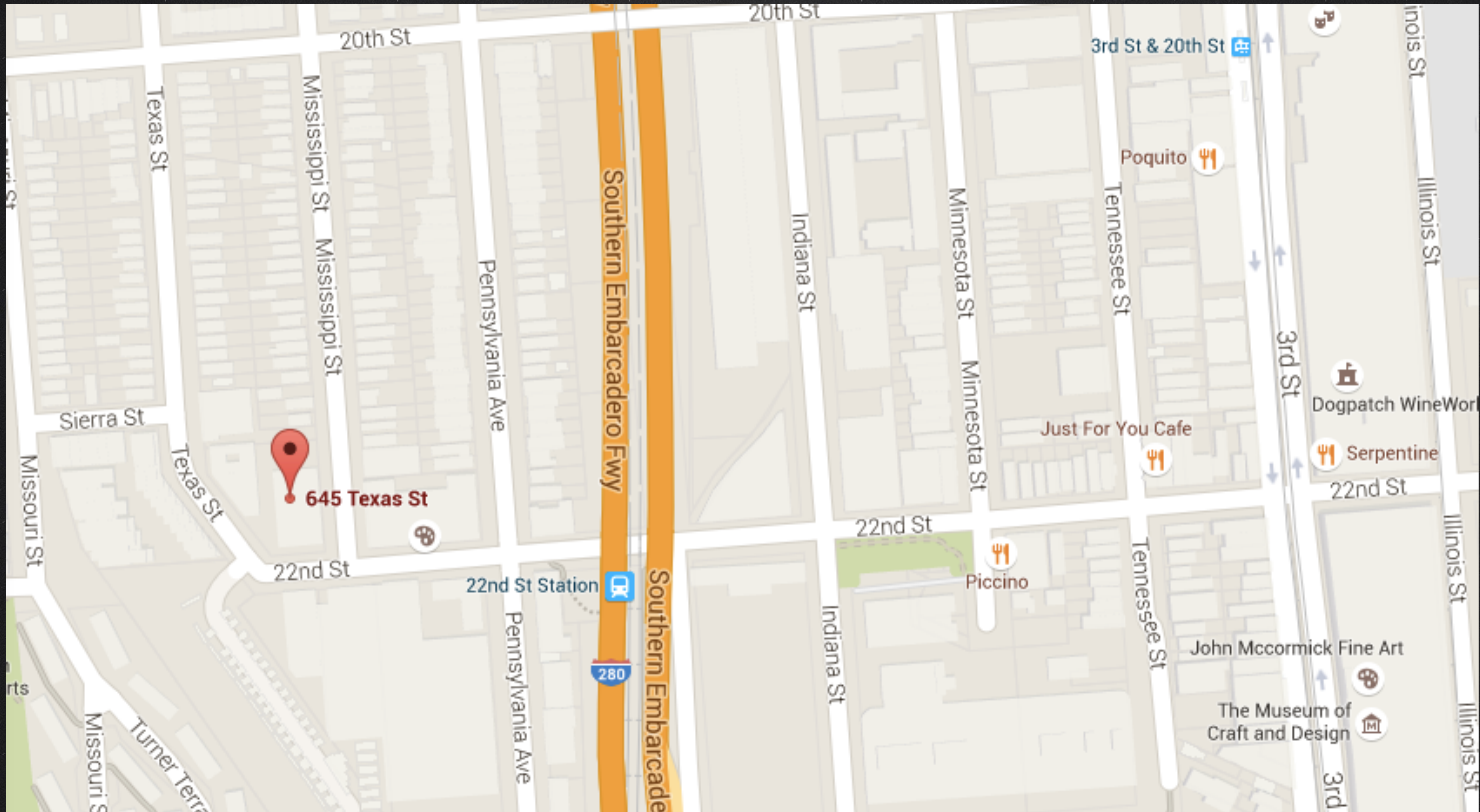

Project Summary

- Trumark Urban seeks to install a long-term temporary sculpture as a response to community requests during outreach for the development
- Proposed to be at the corner of a new residential development currently under construction in the Dogpatch/Potrero Hill area
- Goal is to provide engaging artwork of high aesthetic quality that complements the proposed residential development and embodies characteristics of the surrounding neighborhood
- Provide an dynamic piece that will draw favorable attention to the corner and help further activate and enliven the pedestrian and street experience.

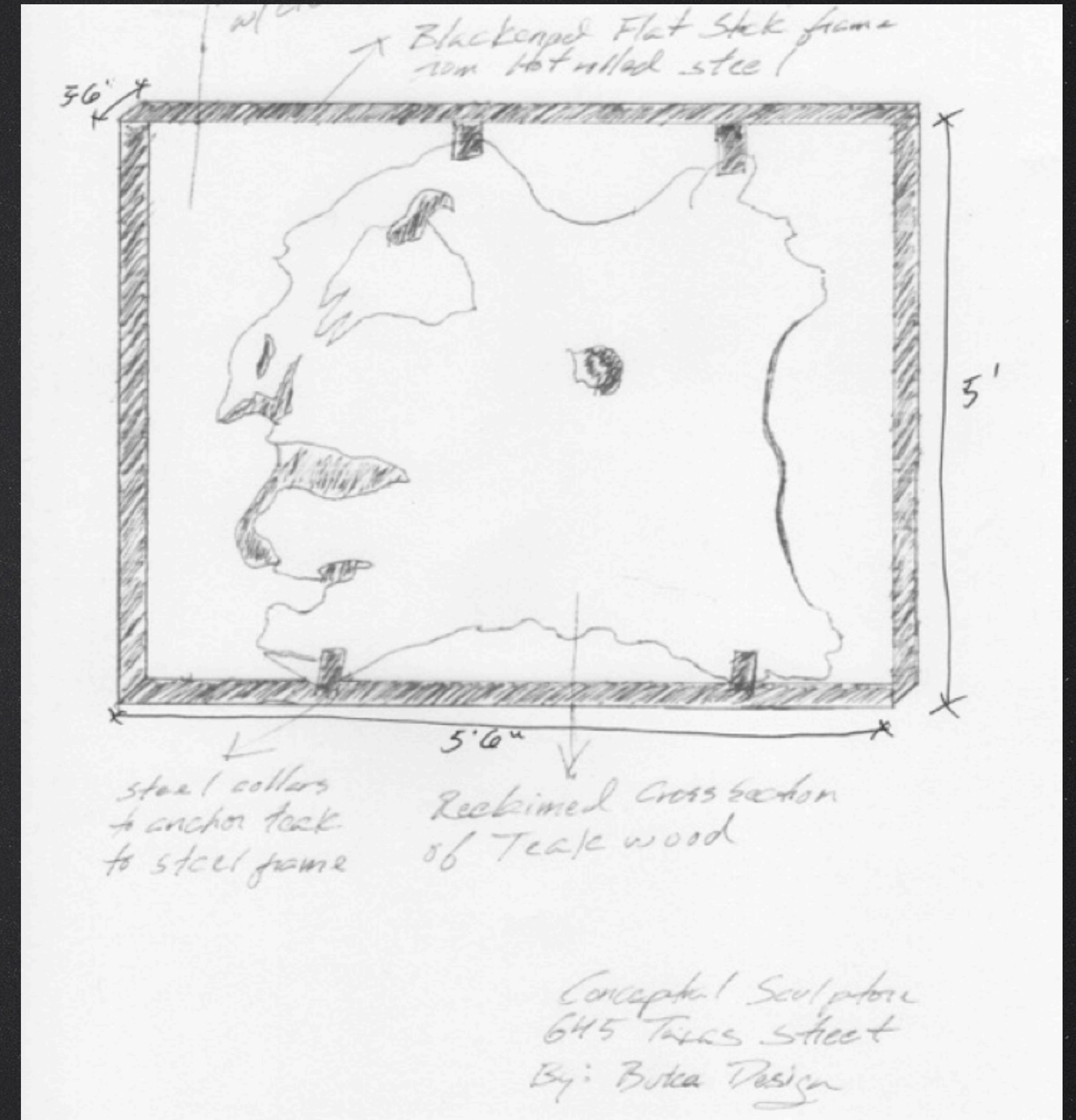
Proposed Art Concept

Project and has elements that tie into the historic fabric of the Dog Patch neighborhood.

The idea is to take a large reclaimed cross section from a Teak wood tree and frame it out using blackened hot rolled steel, which would have steel collars anchoring the teak root to the steel frame.

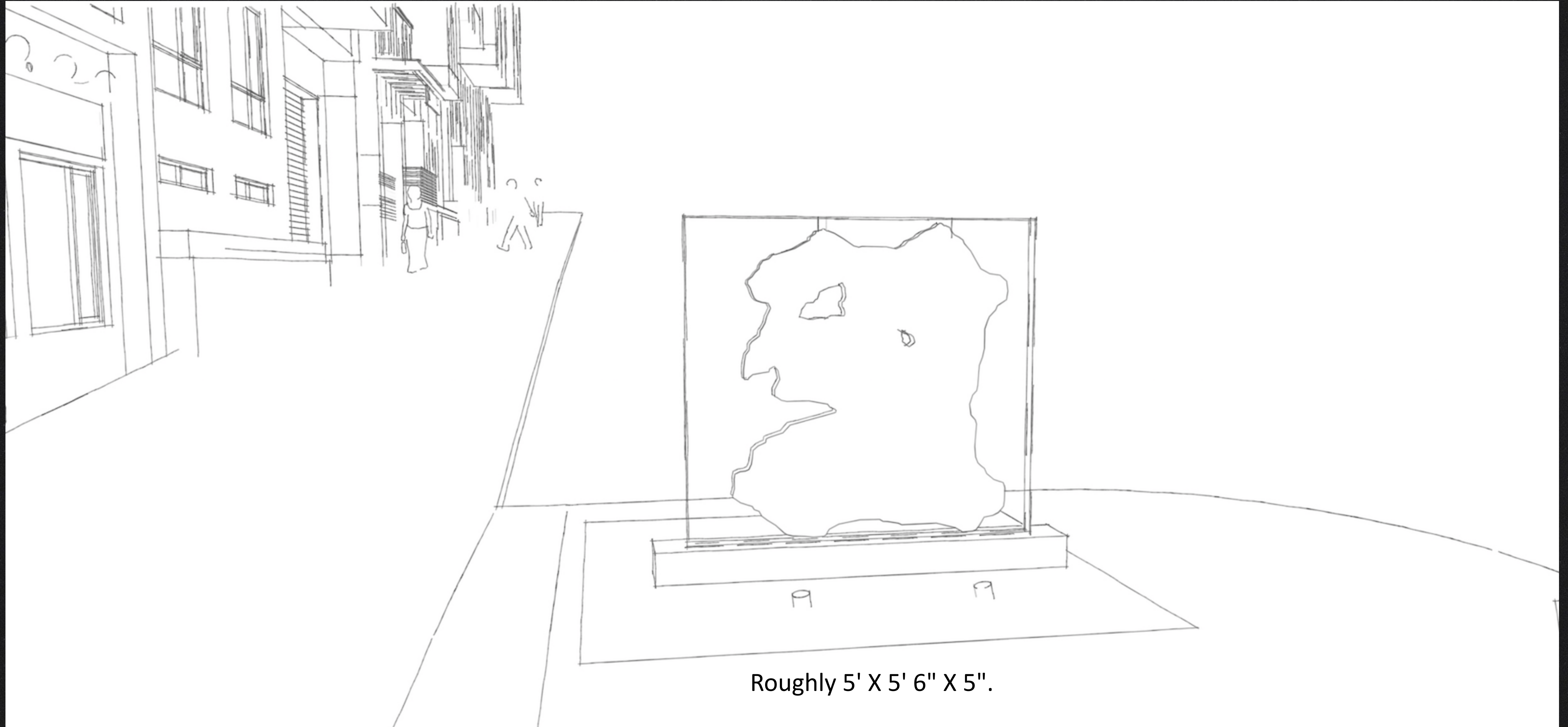
The steel work and the teak tie into the Dog Patch through its historic context as a ship building district and where the last boat yards exist in the city.

Basic Considerations for Artwork

- Recycled and natural materials
- Resistant to rain & wind
- Incorporate light to illuminate at night
- Low maintenance and durable
- Trumark Urban will facilitate any required permits for the artwork and the building's HOA will be responsible for covering the cost and providing ongoing Maintenance
