PROCESS

Arts Commission staff presented the qualifications of 30 artists selected from Mission Bay Park Qualification Panel. "Yes/No" majority votes based on the criteria of Artistic Merit, Relevant Skills and Experience, Appropriate to the Goals of the Civic Art Collection, and Meaningful Connection to San Francisco yielded 20 artists to move to Round Two.

Round Two:

The Artist Selection Panel discussed the qualifications of the semi-finalists and scored each artist on the following criteria (1= low score):

- Artistic Merit (1-5)
- Relevant Skills and Experience (1-3)
- Appropriate to the Goals of the Civic Art Collection (1-2)
- Meaningful Connection to San Francisco (1-5)

Round Two voting yielded 3 finalists to recommend to the Arts Commission.






