Journeys within the San Francisco Bay Area are experienced through a choreography of scale and program - from intimately sized spaces to dramatic moments of expanse. These public places are crucial to how we live our lives; how we interact with each other; and how we inhabit the world around us.

So, how do we incorporate these lofty notions of scale and choreography of spaces into the design of a temporary facility? Through thoughtful analysis of the program and site/human conditions, we have focused our design efforts on several interspersed passenger transition zones - or neighborhoods - strategically located where there is a need for areas to get one's bearings, acclimate to the surroundings, and chart the next step (where the passenger journey transitions from one function to the next). Easily identifiable from a distance yet comfortable at an intimate scale, these 'high touch' neighborhoods create spaces to relax and recharge, affording the individual choices to make their journey unique.
