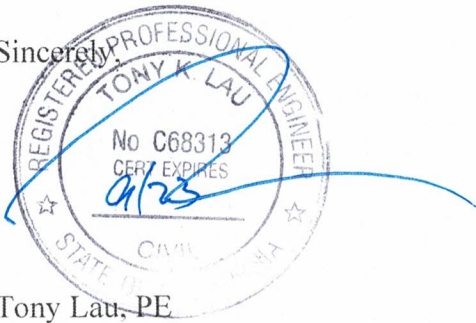

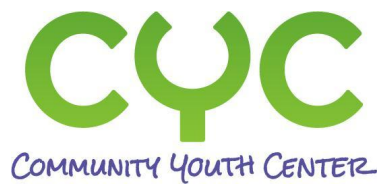
Dear Ms. Jill Manton:

Per our discussion, the Year of the Tiger 2022 Tiger Sculptures that are built by our builder, Ms. Stephanie Mufson, are made with Geof foam (<https://www.geofam.com/>) and 2 coats of fiberglass. The material has a compressive resistance of 320psf and a density of 0.70 lb/ft³. With Safety Factor, the sculpture will be adequate to take 400lb uniform loads on the back of the ox. On behalf of the Community Youth Center of San Francisco, I am writing to support the Chinese New Year project "Tiger on Parade" presented by the San Francisco Chinese Chamber of Commerce (SFCCC).

SFCCC will have six painted fiberglass tiger statues displayed at various San Francisco locations, each approximately 4' high by 5' long. The statues will be displayed at various locations around the Bay Area from January 17th, 2022 to February 19th, 2022 in celebration of the Year of the Tiger. 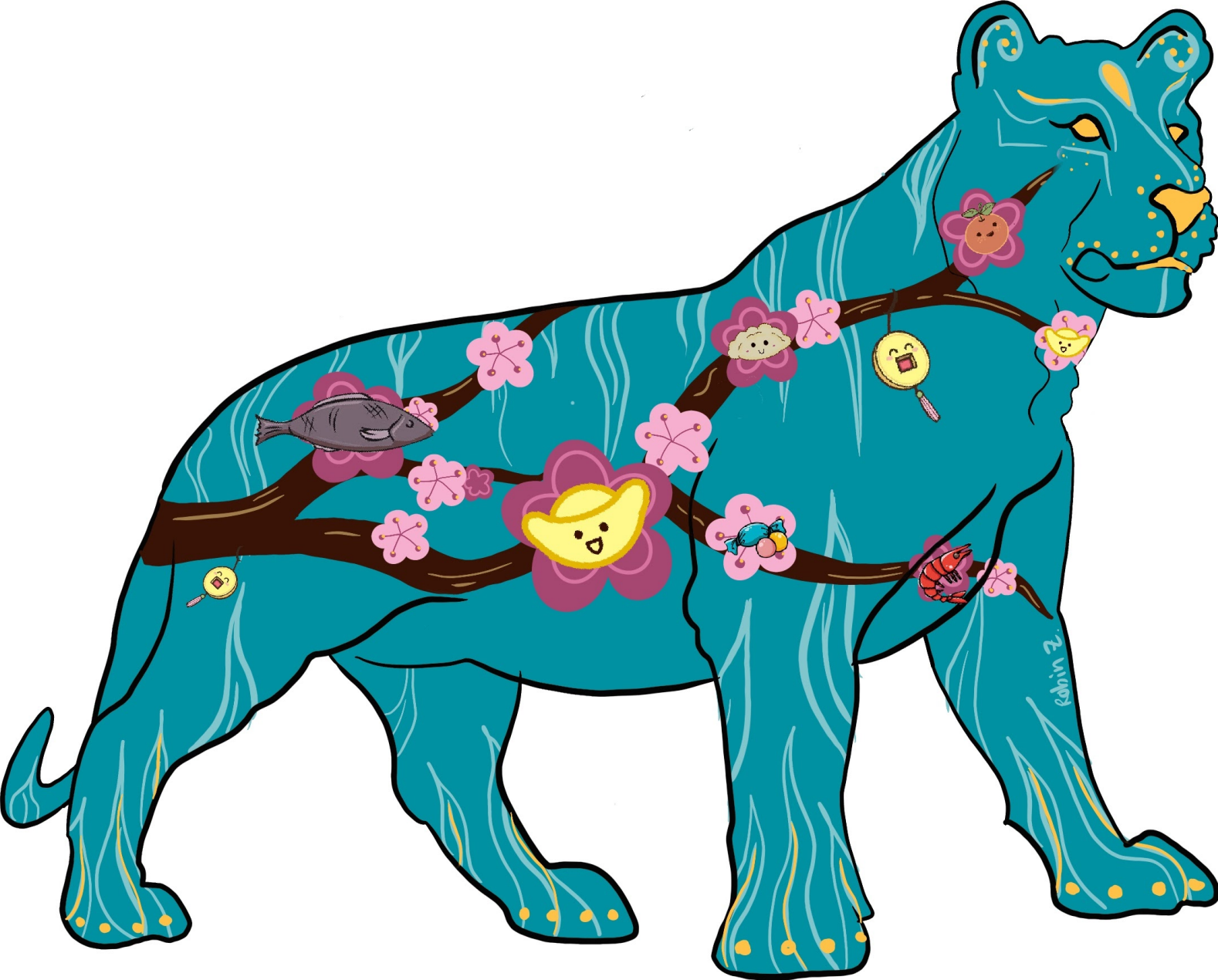
