PROTEST OF CONTRACT AWARD

Please note that selection for grant negotiations does not guarantee a grant with the City. If you believe that the City has incorrectly selected another proposer (applicant) for a grant award, you may submit a written notice of protest. The notice of protest must be received by the City on or before the fifth working day after the issuance of the Notice of Intent to Award. The notice of protest must be received by the Office of Civic Engagement & Immigrant Affairs by 5:00 p.m. PT on Thursday, May 6, 2021, and must include a written statement specifying in detail each and every one of the grounds asserted for the protest. The protest must be signed by an individual authorized to represent the respondent, and must cite the law, rule, local ordinance, procedure or RFP provision on which the protest is based. In addition, the protestor must specify facts and evidence sufficient for the City to determine the validity of the protest.

DELIVERY OF PROTESTS

All protests must be received electronically via email by 5:00pm on Thursday, May 6, 2021. If a protest is mailed, the protestor bears the risk of non-delivery within the deadlines specified herein. Protests should be transmitted by a means that will objectively establish the date the City received the protest. Protests or notice of protests made orally (e.g., by telephone) or by fax will not be considered. Protests must be sent via email by the above date and time to be considered. An electronic response confirming receipt of the protest will be sent within 24 hours of receipt of the original message.
