SF ACC placed 43 animals in foster homes during this quarter
Fostered: 14 cats, 27 dogs, 2 others (hamsters). Many of these fostered animals went on to be adopted from us, while many others were transferred to our adoption partners

ACOs responded to $\mathbf{3 , 0 7 8}$ emergency calls for service this quarter
9 Cats were transported to the Feral Fix/Community Cat Program
(NOTE: Members of the public are instructed to bring feral cats directly to SPCA for their Community Cats program. SF ACC only tracks animals which are impounded at SF ACC and then transported to Community Cats.)
