NOTICE OF COMMISSION HEARING POLICIES AND PROCEDURES

A. Commission Office

B. Policy Requiring Written Reports

It is the policy of the Civil Service Commission that except for appeals filed under Civil Service Commission Rule 111A Position-Based Testing, all items appearing on its agenda be supported by a written report prepared by Commission or departmental staff. All documents referred to in any Agenda Document are posted adjacent to the Agenda, or if more than one (1) page in length, available for public inspection and copying at the Civil Service Commission office. Reports from City and County personnel supporting agenda items are submitted in accordance with the procedures established by the Executive Officer. Reports not submitted according to procedures, in the format and quantity required, and by the deadline, will not be calendared.

C. Policy on Written Submissions by Appellants

All written material submitted by appellants to be considered by the Commission in support of an agenda item shall be submitted to the Commission office, no later than 5:00 p.m. on the fourth (4th) business day preceding the Commission meeting for which the item is calendared (ordinarily, on Tuesday). An original and nine (9) copies on 8 1/2-inch X 11 inch paper, three-hole punched on left margin, and page numbered in the bottom center margin, shall be provided. Written material submitted for the Commission's review becomes part of a public record and shall be open for public inspection.

D. Policy on Materials being Considered by the Commission

Copies of all staff reports and materials being considered by the Civil Service Commission are available for public view 72 hours prior to the Civil Service Commission meeting on the Civil Service Commission's website at www.sfgov.org/Civil_Service, and in its office located at 25 Van Ness Avenue, Suite 720, San Francisco, CA 94102. If any materials related to an item on this agenda have been distributed to the Civil Service Commission after distribution of the agenda packet, those materials will be available for public inspection at the Civil Service Commission's during normal office hours (8:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. Monday through Friday).

E. Policy and Procedure for Hearings to be Scheduled after 5:00 p.m. and Requests for Postponement

A request to hear an item after 5:00 p.m. should be directed to the Executive Officer as soon as possible following the receipt of notification of an upcoming hearing. Requests may be made by telephone at (415) 252-3247 and confirmed in writing or by fax at (415) 252-3260.

A request for a postponement (continuance) to delay an item to another meeting may be directed to the Commission Executive Officer by telephone or in writing. Before acting, the Executive Officer may refer certain requests to another City official for recommendation. Telephone requests must be confirmed in writing prior to the meeting. Immediately following the "Announcement of Changes" portion of the agenda at the beginning of the meeting, the Commission will consider a request for a postponement that has been previously denied. Appeals filed under Civil Service Commission Rule 111A Position-Based Testing shall be considered on the date it is calendared for hearing except under extraordinary circumstances and upon mutual agreement between the appellant and the Department of Human Resources.

F. Policy and Procedure on Hearing Items Out of Order

Requests to hear items out of order are to be directed to the Commission President at the beginning of the agenda. The President will rule on each request. Such requests may be granted with mutual agreement among the affected parties.

G. Procedure for Commission Hearings

All Commission hearings on disputed matters shall conform to the following procedures: The Commission reserves the right to question each party during its presentation and, in its discretion, to modify any time allocations and requirements.

If a matter is severed from the *Consent Agenda* or the *Ratification Agenda*, presentation by the opponent will be for a maximum time limit of five (5) minutes and response by the departmental representative for a maximum time limit of five (5) minutes. Requests by the public to sever items from the [*Consent Agenda* or] *Ratification Agenda* must be provided with justification for the record.

For items on the *Regular Agenda*, presentation by the departmental representative for a maximum time of five (5) minutes and response by the opponent for a maximum time limit of five (5) minutes.

For items on the *Separations Agenda*, presentation by the department followed by the employee or employee's representative shall be for a maximum time limit of ten (10) minutes for each party unless extended by the Commission. Each presentation shall conform to the following:

3. Corroborating witnesses, if necessary; and
4. Closing remarks.

The Commission may allocate five (5) minutes for each side to rebut evidence presented by the other side.

H. Policy on Audio Recording of Commission Meetings

I. Speaking before the Civil Service Commission

Speaker cards are not required. The Commission will take public comment on all items appearing on the agenda at the time the item is heard. The Commission will take public comment on matters not on the Agenda, but within the jurisdiction of the Commission during the "Requests to Speak" portion of the regular meeting. Maximum time will be three (3) minutes. A subsequent comment after the three (3) minute period is limited to one (1) minute. The timer shall be in operation during public comment. Upon any specific request by a Commissioner, time may be extended.

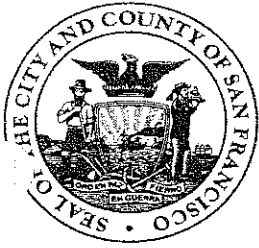

B. Explain why this service is necessary and the consequence of denial:

The service is the necessary first step in a long process to explore potential locations of the Bayshore Caltrain station, with analyses and a conceptual station design. Contracted services are necessary because the City does not have the expertise or staffing to perform the specialized services in-house. Services include railroad planning, engineering, and operations experience of a Class I railroad and facilities; high-speed rail; railroad station design; railroad station placement; and engineering. In addition, Contractor is responsible for following all federally mandated regulations and guidelines and maintaining all required licenses.

B. Explain why this service is necessary and the consequences of denial:

Muni's revenue fleet consists of 842 rubber-tire vehicles. Each vehicle requires between six to ten tires, not including spares. In order to procure, transport, mount, dismount, maintain, service, track and dispose of the thousands of tires necessary to keep Muni's rubber-tire fleet operating, Muni would have to expend millions of dollars to purchase tires and specialized equipment and hire an extensive staff with a broad range of skills and expertise. Outsourcing all aspects of a tire program, including leasing versus purchasing tires, tracking and maintenance support, and provision of 24-hour/7-days-a-week emergency roadside service via customized vehicles, is by far the most efficient, cost-effective approach. Due to the prohibitive costs and extensive workforce needed to manage an in-house tire program, it is common practice for transit agencies to lease tires rather than purchase them and to contract out all support services. This practice establishes a fixed price per mile for the tires used rather than one that varies depending on road and vehicle condition. No civil service classification exists that could provide this service. Denial of this contract would severely impact, if not ground, Muni's rubber-tire revenue fleet.

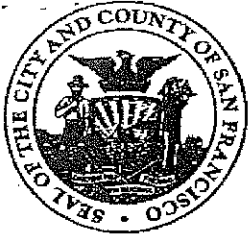

3. DESCRIPTION OF REQUIRED SKILLS/EXPERTISE

- A. **Specify required skills and/or expertise:** This work requires extensive experience in and an expert understanding of municipal bond financing and issuance, bond structuring and pricing. Knowledge of the current capital market conditions is also required, as is the ability to make cogent and thorough presentations to rating agencies and underwriters.
- B. **Which, if any, civil service class normally performs this work?** Staff performing related functions are in a variety of civil service classifications including: 1823 Senior Administrative Analyst, 1824 Principal Administrative Analyst, 1825 Principal Administrative Analyst II, and 9377 Feasibility Analyst, Port. None of these classifications, however, require expertise in bond structuring and pricing, or knowledge of current capital market conditions.
- C. **Will contractor provide facilities and/or equipment not currently possessed by the City? If yes, explain:**
Yes, the work requires that use of various bond pricing models, access to financial market information services and municipal bond trading desks at investment banks that the City does not currently subscribe and/or have access to. Subscription fees to all services is relatively high, not cost effective for the City given the infrequent need for financial advisory services.

4. WHY CLASSIFIED CIVIL SERVICE CANNOT PERFORM

- A. **Explain why civil service classes are not applicable:** The civil services classes listed in item, 3B above, perform related functions. However, the expertise required is very specialized, and does not currently exist within the City. As a result, all City Departments contract out for financial advisory services needed for debt issuances. The expertise of municipal bond financing, bond structuring, and knowledge of knowledge of current capital market conditions is only obtained by personnel who are engaged in debt issuance on a day-to-day basis. This day-to-day contact with underwriters, municipal bond trading desks at investment firms, investors, and other capital market participants is not covered within the duties of any existing civil service classifications.
- B. **Would it be practical to adopt a new civil service class to perform this work? Explain?** No, given the specialized nature of the work, and infrequent need for these services it would not be practical to have individuals from on the existing classes listed in item 3B trained to perform this work. In addition, the work requires access to various specialized bond pricing and structuring models, investment firm municipal bond trading desks, and financial market information services; the cost of which would be impractical given the workload. Furthermore, contracting out these services will reduce the City's risk exposure if mistakes are made by less experienced and knowledgeable staff.





“5000. This part shall be known and may be cited as the Lanterman-Petris-Short Act.

In order to achieve uniform statewide implementation of the policies of this act, it is necessary to establish the statewide policy that, notwithstanding any other provision of law, no city or county shall discriminate in the enactment, enforcement, or administration of any zoning laws, ordinances, or rules and regulations between the use of property for the treatment of general hospital or nursing home patients and the use of property for the psychiatric care and treatment of patients, both inpatient and outpatient. Health facilities for inpatient and outpatient psychiatric care and treatment shall be permitted in any area zoned for hospitals or nursing homes, or in which hospitals and nursing homes are permitted by conditional use permit.”

“5652.5. (a) Each county shall utilize available private and private nonprofit mental health resources and facilities in the county prior to developing new county-operated resources or facilities when these private and private nonprofit mental health resources or facilities are of at least equal quality and cost as county-operated resources and facilities and shall utilize available county resources and facilities of at least equal quality and cost prior to new private and private nonprofit resources and facilities. All the available local public or private and private nonprofit facilities shall be utilized before state hospitals are used. (b) Nothing in this section shall prevent a county from restructuring its systems of care in the manner it believes will provide the best overall care.”

“5653. In developing the county Short-Doyle plan, optimum use shall be made of appropriate local public and private organizations, community professional personnel, and state agencies. Optimum use shall also be made of federal, state, county, and private funds which may be available for mental health planning. In order that maximum utilization be made of federal and other funds made available to the Department of Rehabilitation, the Department of Rehabilitation may serve as a contractual provider under the provisions of a county Short-Doyle plan of vocational rehabilitation services for the mentally disordered.”

Design/build a new marine structure along south Ocean Beach, starting at Sloat Boulevard and extending south along the Great Highway to the Oceanside Wastewater Treatment Plant in San Francisco. The purpose of this structure is to control and manage the retreat of the ocean bluffs in this area while protecting the Lake Merced Tunnel.

The bluffs(section) along Ocean Beach south of Sloat Blvd. have been steadily eroding. Scope of Services and Project Summary

Project Overview

The City of San Francisco's 2008 Proposition A, Clean and Safe Parks General Obligation Bond provides approximately \$22.5 million for Blue Greenway open space improvement projects along the San Francisco waterfront. Crane Cove park is one of five such designated parks funded as a part of the Blue Greenway that connects open spaces along the San Francisco Bay Trail and the San Francisco Bay Water Trail, from Mission Creek to the County line.

The City's 2006 Blue-Greenway Task Force identified a series of open space improvements to benefit the City's southern neighborhoods and continue public waterfront access southward. The Crane Cove site proposes a new major waterfront park adjacent to the Pier 70 shipyard; along Illinois Street, in the Dogpatch/Potrero neighborhoods. Crane Cove Park would be integrated with restoration of incredible maritime historic structures, as envisioned in the Port's overall Pier 70 Master Plan.

The Site

This site brings complexity that requires expertise beyond that which existing city staff are capable of providing, yet the project does not provide sufficient work to justify adding multiple staff will not be needed on a full-time basis during the project and not needed beyond the project.

The complexities include the existence of two cranes that have been designated as historic structures of which its structural integrity has to be carefully examined given the intended use of the site as a public park. This risk associated with this site condition required ultimate due diligence on the part of the Port to assure that the park is properly designed. For the most part, the site sits over water and was previously used as ship repair facility.

The Project Approach/General Scope of Services

On September 16, 2010, Port staff met with representatives of Local 21, DPW and Parks/Recreation Departments to discuss the requirements of this project and come to an agreement as to the approach. The agreed approach is as follows:

The Port intends to manage this project in four (4) phases as follows:

PHASE	SCHEDULE FOR COMPLETION
1. Site Assessment, Conceptual Design and Cost Estimates	October 2011
1.a Environmental Review/Regulatory Permitting	July 2012
2. Preliminary Design (Preferred Design and Cost Estimate	April 2012
3. Detailed Design Development, Final Cost Estimate and Construction Bidding	May 2012
4. Construction	September 2014

It is proposed that the consultant team selected for contract award would be awarded up to the entire scope of work that includes all four phases. Therefore, the only guaranteed contract work is Phase 1 – Site Assessment and Conceptual Design. Port and DPW staff will be included as part of the project team during the Phase 1 portion of this work.

A Notice to Proceed for subsequent phases would be subject to the Department of Public Works Landscape Architecture and Bureau of Engineering reviewing the Phase 1 work and providing a competitive proposal for subsequent phases of the project work. Should the Department of Public Works choose to perform all or part of the work and can do so within the required schedule for a reasonable fee with the GO Bond budget, the remaining work will be performed by city staff.

It is Port staff's intent that in the recommendation for contract award from a competitive selection process, the contract will generally stipulate the above conditions

The majority of the work requires expertise in the design of marine structures. The most qualified staff in the City that can perform this work are engineers based at the Port. Port engineering staff workloads are committed to maintenance projects and capital projects that can be included in their workload. Other City agencies generally do not employ engineers whose specialty is marine engineering and for such dilapidated structures as those held by the Port. Engineers who design marine structures must consider long-term performance of materials and structure details within the context of the marine environment, as well as factors such as infrastructure exposed to tidal and wave action, and marine construction techniques and methods.

B. Would it be practical to adopt a new civil service class to perform this work? Explain.

No. The Port projects currently scheduled (other than routine maintenance) are capital projects that are of a short duration. As such, the fluctuation in need for this expertise is difficult to plan for on a full-time workload basis. This project is scheduled to be bid this fall in order to meet bond issuance schedules. Even if this project were of longer duration, there is not sufficient time to create one or more new civil service classes and complete the hiring process for the performance of these design services.





1. DESCRIPTION OF WORK

A. Concise description of proposed work:
Provide additional design, environmental and permitting services needed prior to construction of the Calaveras Dam Replacement Project (CDRP) to develop a comprehensive compliance plan for the occurrence of naturally occurring asbestos (NOA) at the project site, address the future restoration of steelhead in Alameda Creek into the project, provide designs to mitigate impacts associated with the CDRP, provide supplemental dam safety engineering analyses requested by the California Division of Safety of Dams (DSOD), and ongoing permitting support; and to provide engineering support during construction, start-up, and commissioning of the project.

B. Explain why this service is necessary and the consequences of denial:
In 2001, the DSOD determined Calaveras Dam to be seismically unsafe. Calaveras Dam is a critical component of the SFPUC water system, providing 40% of the system's local water storage. Since 2001, Calaveras Reservoir has been operated at a level of 30% of its capacity, significantly impairing local water storage, system reliability, water quality, and fish habitat. If professional engineering services are denied, the project cannot move forward because the SFPUC does not have the in-house expertise or experience in dam design, NOA compliance, and the required engineering support services needed during construction, start-up and commissioning of a new dam.

C. Explain how this service has been provided in the past (if this service was previously approved by the Civil Service Commission, indicate most recent personal services services contract approval number):
These services were provided in the past under PSC # 4098-02/03.

3. DESCRIPTION OF REQUIRED SKILLS/EXPERTISE

A. Specify required skills and/or expertise:

Specialty experience and expertise in the field of dam engineering, design and construction: geotechnical, earthquake, hydraulic and structural engineering. The following areas of expertise are also required: civil, mechanical, electrical engineering as they relate to dam and reservoir facilities; engineering geology, soil mechanics, rock mechanics, grouting, and foundation treatment; environmental issues related to dam construction; cost estimating and construction scheduling related to dams; specialty expertise in permitting related to steelhead and other endangered species; and specialty expertise and experience in construction compliance related to naturally occurring asbestos (NOA).

B. Which, if any, civil service class normally performs this work?

The following civil service classifications normally perform engineering work in the disciplines of civil, mechanical, electrical (Classifications: 5203, 5207, 5241, and 5211) and structural engineering (Classifications: 5281 and 5219).

C. Will contractor provide facilities and/or equipment not currently possessed by the City? If yes, explain:

Yes. A significant part of the work involves specialized computer modeling for geotechnical and earthquake engineering analysis, jar testing for portable treatment plant design, collection of air and water samples for NOA analysis, laboratory testing of air & water samples for NOA and metals (testing to be provided by specialty laboratories using methods and equipment that the SFPUC does not possess).

4. WHY CLASSIFIED CIVIL SERVICE CANNOT PERFORM

A. Explain why civil service classes are not applicable:

There are no specific civil service classifications in the fields of geotechnical engineering, earthquake engineering of embankments, engineering geology, dam design, spillway design, and development of compliance plans for naturally occurring asbestos (NOA). With respect to project tasks in the civil, mechanical, and electrical engineering disciplines, these tasks focus on dam, spillway, and intake tower design. SFPUC civil, mechanical, and electrical staff do not have experience with design issues related to replacement dam construction or associated facilities. The structural engineering tasks on this project focus on dam foundation design; SFPUC staff have no experience with dam foundation design.

B. Would it be practical to adopt a new civil service class to perform this work? Explain.

No. There are few projects of this type; the required expertise would not be utilized on a full-time, permanent basis.
