LBEAC April 6, 2017 Meeting Minutes

1. Call to Order

- 2. Update on the Best Value Public Works Procurement
 - a. Nicholas King of Public Works presented an update on the Best Value Public Works Procurement.
 - i. Focusing on technology and technical issues.
 - ii. In May, there will be a briefing for department heads.
- 3. Update on the Mentor-Protégé Program
 - b. Lupe Arreola briefly presented on the demographics of the Program
 - i. Majority of the protégés are Minority Business Enterprise (MBE).
 - ii. 64% of protégés are in zip codes 94124 and 94134 -- industrial neighborhoods.
- 4. City's Bonding Financial Assistance Program
 - a. Topic has been postponed because the presenter was unable to attend.
- 5. How to Increase Participation on City Contracts
 - a. Boris Delepine provided summary of the current processes and invited suggestions on how to increase LBE participation and diversify the pool of LBEs.
 - a. Ideas include: reaching out to larger companies; look ahead to upcoming projects; adding subcontractors at different junctures.
- 6. Definition of Specialty Contractor
 - a. Topic has been postponed.

7. Discussion of the Proposed PLA Legislation

a. The initial reading of the proposed legislation will take place in a few weeks. Stated purpose of legislation is to ensure steady labor force and to ensure against labor strikes by acting as a mechanism for settling disputes between unions. It is likely the legislation will pass because it currently has seven cosponsors and only needs six to pass.

b. Public comment:

- a. Controller's Office previously reported that the PLA legislation is attempting to fix a problem that does not exist; the last labor strike was more than 30 years ago and collective bargaining agreements are in place for the next two years.
- b. Requiring union labor would lead to labor shortage and ultimately, labor would have to be supplied by different cities, thereby harming local community.
- c. With PLA in place, non-union apprentices will be excluded from City projects, which would mean exclusion of many San Francisco residents. Non-union workers receive the same training as union workers so no valid reason to exclude them.
- d. By having to make union dues, construction firms would have less to compensate employees/construction workers.
- e. The 1 million dollar threshold is adversarial to LBE firms. The legislation will effectively shut out LBE firms and ultimately destroy the LBE program.
- f. The proposed legislation will very likely impact the LBE community but no input/suggestions were invited from the community or from the LBEAC.

8. Approval of Meeting Minutes

- a. CMD certification staff is working to recertify as many LBE firms as possible before the FSP rollout.
- b. Since November 2016, the number of LBE firms has increased by fifty.

a. Possibly recommend that the Mentor-Protégé program be an option for the Community Benefits program.
