On July 10, <u>Commissioner Sonia Melara</u> was sworn in to the Commission on the Status of Women by Mayor Mark Ferrell. Commissioner Melara has served on many Commissions in San Francisco, most recently as member of the San Francisco Police Commission, and she was Executive Director of the Department from 1995-2001.



On August 7, Leadership and staff from the Department and the <u>San Francisco Environment</u> met to discuss October's Joint Commission meeting. The San Francisco Environment is hosting the Global Climate Action Summit 2018 this month. The Joint Commission meeting in October will bring together concerns for women and the environment.



At the August 22 meeting, the Commission recognized Anne Kronenberg for her many contributions. Ms. Kronenberg retired as Executive Director of the Department of Emergency Management, a position she held since 2010. She has had a distinguished career in public service for over 40 years, beginning as legislative aide for Supervisor Harvey Milk. She has been an advocate for diverse communities, including women, LGBTQ individuals, and communities of color, throughout her career.



At the 2018 National Association of Commissions for Women (NACW) conference that took place in Los Angeles in August the San Francisco Healthy Mothers Workplace Awards Program was presented with an achievement award.



On August 23 in honor of Women's Equality Day, Mayor London Breed, Congresswoman Nancy Pelosi, and many other leaders launched a challenge to increase voter registration in the city. The W Challenge, put together by San Francisco Assessor-Recorder Carmen Chu, the League of Women Voters, and our Department, is challenging residents to, in addition to pledge to vote, also help register one woman who isn't already registered to vote and to bring one woman along to vote on election day. On September 10 in the South Light Court at City Hall, Commissioner Andrea Shorter and Department staff joined State, Civic, and Union leaders to stand against sexual harassment and assault in the workplace and to reaffirm San Francisco's commitment as a Sanctuary City. This event launched the group of promotoras on a march of immigrant women to Sacramento to raise awareness of

sexual assault of janitors across California.



The Family Violence Council honored Assistant District Attorney Liz Aguilar-Tarchi who retired from the District Attorney's Office in August. Ms. Aguilar-Tarchi has been a wonderful community collaborator bringing great passion and care to her focus of domestic violence prosecutions. We wish for well, and look forward to her next chapter.
