



APPENDIX B: CALENDAR OF KEY DATES AND DEADLINES

Date	Deadline
Saturday, April 23	Deadline to transmit ballots to military and overseas voters who have requested them by that date. Transmission of ballots to voters who have submitted applications after this date continues through Tuesday, May 31.
Monday, May 9	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Voting opens at the Department’s Voting Center on the ground floor of City Hall, Monday through Friday, 8 a.m.–5 p.m. • Voters who have applied to vote by mail for all elections begin receiving their ballots. Mailing to new applicants continues through Tuesday, May 31. • Deadline to mail the Voter Information Pamphlets and Sample Ballots to voters. Mailing to voters who have registered after this date continues through Tuesday, May 31.
Monday, May 23	Last day to register to vote for the June 7 election. Voters who have moved, changed their name or party preference must re-register.
Monday, May 23	First day the Department begins opening accepted vote-by-mail ballot envelopes and removing ballots in preparation for counting.
Tuesday, May 24- Tuesday, May 31	Extension of registration deadline for people who become new residents after the registration deadline, May 23. New residents are eligible to vote only for president and vice president.
Tuesday, May 24- Tuesday, June 7	Extension of registration deadline for new citizens who are sworn in after the registration deadline, May 23.
Saturday, May 28- Sunday, May 29	Weekend Voting at the City Hall Voting Center, 10 a.m.–4 p.m.
Tuesday, May 31	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Last day to request a vote-by-mail ballot; mailed or hand-delivered applications must be received by the Department by 5 p.m. Online vote-by-mail applications must be submitted no later than 11:59 p.m. • Deadline to complete Logic and Accuracy testing of the voting equipment to be used to tabulate ballots.
Wednesday, June 1- Tuesday, June 7	During this period vote-by-mail ballots are available to voters who are unable to vote at the polls.
Saturday, June 4- Sunday, June 5	Weekend Voting at the City Hall Voting Center, 10 a.m.–4 p.m. Ballot drop off stations are open during the same hours.
Tuesday, June 7, Election Day	Polling places, the City Hall Voting Center and ballot drop off stations are open, 7 a.m. – 8 p.m. For personal delivery or facsimile transmission (voters living outside of the United States or called for military service within United States on or after May 31 <i>only</i>), ballots must be received by the Department no later than Election Day, 8 p.m.
Wednesday, June 8- Thursday, July 7	Official Canvass period. Random selection of precincts for a 1% manual tally takes place on Tuesday, June 14.
Friday, June 10	Deadline for mail or delivery service receipt of vote-by-mail ballots.
Thursday, July 7	Deadline to complete Canvass, certify its results, and submit it to the Board of Supervisors.
Friday, July 8	Deadline to submit the Statement of Results to the Secretary of State.
