Proposed Policy Aims Public Election Results Reporting

The purpose of this document is to propose for the Commission's consideration a possible list of high-level policy aims, or goals, regarding reporting election results to the public. As such, they focus on the "what," as opposed to how these goals can be achieved.

- 1. The public should be able to learn, directly from the main results page (so without having to navigate to another page), basic information about each contest, including
 - a. the current winner or winners of each local contest,
 - b. the current vote and percent totals of each winner, and
 - c. in the case of ranked-choice voting (RCV) contests, the <u>current RCV final-round</u> <u>vote and percent totals</u> (e.g. after reducing to two candidates).

"Current" in the above means based on the ballots that have been counted so far.

- 2. When viewing the main results page, the public should understand roughly how far along the tabulation is, including
 - a. what percent of ballots have been counted so far, approximately (relative to how many ballots are estimated to be counted overall), and
 - b. about how many days it will be before some higher percentage will be counted (so the public can know how long they may need to wait).
