Cannabis Event Permit Ordinance Signed Into Law

Mayor London Breed signed the Cannabis Event Permit Ordinance into law on March 29, 2019. This <u>ordinance</u> provides the <u>SF Office of Cannabis</u> with procedures to regulate cannabis events and give local approval of these permits before final sign-off from the State of CA.

A pilot program will run through Dec. 2019 that allows the Office of Cannabis to issue permits for events that meet ALL of the following criteria:

 The event has previously been held on a regular basis;
The event, in prior years, has received a City-issued permit; and

3. At the event, in prior years, there has been significant unregulated cannabis sales or consumption, which the Director determine

unregulated cannabis sales or consumption, which the Director determines could be reduced or eliminated at the event by the issuance of a Cannabis Events Permit.

New Online Permit Application for One Time Outdoor Events

On May 1st, the Entertainment Commission switched to a new online permit application for One Time Outdoor Events. To view the new application, visit **https://sfgov.forms.fm/one-time** -outdoor-event-permit, or visit the Entertainment Commission's <u>Permit Applications page</u>.

WHAT'S NEW:

- A digital end-to-end application process: No more downloading PDFs, no more printing. You can now use your mobile device to show your permit at the event.
- Automated email notifications: You will now receive automated emails that confirm receipt of the application, show changes in status, and provide the issued permit.
- A single application for outdoor events with entertainment and/or amplified sound.





Single-Use Foodware Plastics, Toxics and Litter Reduction Ordinance Goes Into Effect July 1, 2019

The City's *Single-Use Foodware Plastics, Toxics, and Litter Reduction Ordinance* goes into effect July 1, 2019. This means:

- All food vendors, including those contracting with events permitted by the City and County of San Francisco, must comply.
- Acceptable single-use food and beverage accessories can only be available upon request or in a self-service area.

Starting January 1, 2020:

- All events on City property must ensure that 10% of attendees bring or have access to reusable beverage cups. This rule includes events on City streets, sidewalks, parks, & plazas.
- All compostable food ware must be BPI Certified (products.bpiworld.org)

One-Stop Permit Center Opening in 2020

The City and County of San Francisco is constructing a new one-stop permit center and office building located at 49 South Van Ness Ave.

Scheduled to open by summer 2020, this permit center will be a one-stop shop for special events, businesses, and construction permits. The facility will also co-locate City departments providing permitting services. The Entertainment Commission will move into this new building and will have a presence at the new permit center.
