

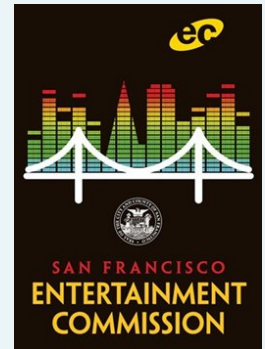

**Zellerbach Family Foundation—Community Arts Program Grants** provide project-based support to small and mid-sized arts organizations and individual artists for the creation and presentation of new and innovative work that is representative of the diverse cultures and communities of the Bay Area. Range \$1,500 – \$10,000.

**Kenneth Rainin Foundation—Open Spaces Program Grants** offer support to non-profit organizations to partner with artists to create temporary, place-based public art projects in San Francisco and Oakland that:

- Are exceptional, visionary projects with a high impact
- Include an artist-initiated process of community engagement
- Exhibit cultural experimentation and innovation
- Leverage civic and neighborhood resources and cultural assets

Range \$50,000 – \$200,000 per project.
