### Placement Statistical Information

At the request of Commissioner Dirk Bejin on behalf of the program commission meeting held on June 5, 2006, statistical data was presented by the Supervisor of the Placement unit, Karen Starkes and Jose Perla, IT Director. The following is an update:

Out of Home Placement Commitments from January 1 through June 13, 2006: 71  
Out of Home placement commitments from January 1 through May 30, 2005: 86 (-15)

After two meetings with Information Services and the Placement unit Supervisor, the methodology used to analyze the data was refined, resulting in the following information:

#### Days spent from Disposition to start date in placement:

Mode: 6

Median: 22 (35 above and 35 below)

Average: 34 (7 youth spent over 100 days in the Juvenile Hall)

#### Information that could be analyzed for Case Processing meetings:

Days spent in Juvenile Hall from detention date to start date in placement  
Days spent in Juvenile Hall from adjudication to start date in placement  
Days spent in Juvenile Hall from disposition to start date in placement

#### Commission Report:

The staff created a template for a regular report that will be submitted to the JPC program committee commencing in August 2006. This will include:

- How many youth are currently in Placement beds in California?
- Gender specific data
- Age data
- Where are they placed?
- How long have they been in the facility?
- How many Mode, Median and Average days in detention spent from disposition to placement start date?

- How many youth are currently in placement beds outside of the State of California?
- Gender specific data
- Age data
- How long have they been in the facility?
- How many days in detention spent from disposition to out-of-state placement start date?
  
- How many youth are committed to out of home placement in the home of a relative as a result of a (Non-Relative Extended Family Member) NREFM?
- Gender specific data
- Age date
- Where are they placed?
- How long have they been in the home?
- How many days in detention spent from disposition for NRFEM placements?

## **CARC**

The Juvenile Probation Department and CARC staff has been meeting regularly since June 8, 2006 to discuss case processing and CARC and JPD operational issues. CARC has reported an increase in referrals from the Juvenile Probation Department this 2005-06 fiscal year. The staff continues to meet weekly for case reviews and to discuss referrals to CARC from JPD. These meetings have resulted in the following operational changes:

- Probation Officers assigned to CARC will be trained on 601 W&I protocols
- Probation Officers assigned to CARC will be trained on live scan protocols
- The YGC Duty Probation Officer will keep a daily log, including CARC referrals
- The Probation Officer assigned to CARC will submit a JC-44 with a face sheet to the Juvenile Probation Department within 90 days. The information will be entered in the JJIS.
- The Probation Officers assigned to CARC will receive a password to access JJIS and e mail at the facility
- Protocol changes between Huckleberry House, JPD and CARC will be explored to form a closer working relationship between the agencies

### Commission Report:

The Juvenile Probation Department's Information Technology and Probation Division Directors will provide the Commission with monthly documentation from CARC that will include the following subsets commencing August 2006:

- Referrals from SFPD resulting in intake at CARC
- Referrals from the Juvenile Probation Department diverted from formal intervention to CARC
- Referrals/Citations from the Juvenile Probation Department to CARC
- 601 referrals to CARC from the Juvenile Probation Department and the community
- 601 referrals to CARC resulting in a petition
