ACTIVITIES


Lead monthly court-mandated introductory Orientations to youth, & their parent/guardian, who have recently been placed on Probation.

- o 36 Other


3 YRS OF ORIENTATION PARTICIPANTS 2009-2012

VIOLATION OF PROBATION RATES OUT OF 192 YOUTH THAT WE HAVE AT LEAST 1 YR OF DATA

 Only 12.5% post orientation sustained probation violation

• 87.5% Did not violate probation
