ABOUT

The JAC is a group of young people who use their experience of going through the system to educate others and provide support and knowledge to those in need.

Our goal is to reduce the number of youth who are locked up and get stuck in the cycle of the system.

If hired, you would speak to groups of youth who are looking for inspiration and guidance during their probation term.

Every first Saturday of the month the JAC members speak with youth and their families at the SF Juvenile Justice Center. JAC Members also present workshops at schools and community programs in SF.
