

Vehicle Burglary

Ingleside Officers Parker and Bobila were dispatched to a report of an auto burglary of a car parked near the intersection of Cayuga and Lyell. Neighbors, viewing surveillance video had noticed two suspects breaking into a parked car. Parker and Bobila were joined by Officer Joseph who found both suspects on nearby streets. They were positively identified by the victim and witnesses. One was arrested and charged with auto burglary before being transported to the County Jail. Trespassing

6:40pm 700 Blk. Ocean Vehicle Burglary

A school employee, entering the staff parking lot, spotted an unknown man pick up a rock and break the passenger window of a parked car. She then watched as the suspect entered the vehicle and quickly exited carrying a pair of brown shoes. Ingleside Officers Labson and Plummer arrived and placed the suspect in custody. Another witness approached the officers and told them she observed the suspect throwing rocks at four school building windows shortly before he entered the parking lot. The school facilities manager said the replacement cost of each window was \$10,000. The suspect was transported to Ingleside Station and booked for vehicle burglary and vandalism. 11:30am Geneva & Mission Fraud

A man walked into Ingleside Station with a sad tale of monetary loss and regret. The victim told Ingleside Officer Scott that he was approached by two unknown men while in a store at Geneva and Mission. One of the men was on the phone and the second suspect and the victim listened to a voice on the phone verifying Lottery numbers as winners. The suspects told the victim that they needed help cashing the Lottery check and if he gave them \$13,000 they would redeem the ticket and pay him back his money plus \$57,000 dollars of the winnings. The victim complied and withdrew the money and then was told to go to the post office on Onondaga Street to buy stamps. The victim agreed and when he exited the post office the suspects were no longer waiting outside and fled with his \$13,000 dollars. Report number: 190202233

2:30pm 3600 Blk. Folsom Hot Prowl Burglary

A woman home alone heard the sound of glass breaking at the entrance to her residence. She went downstairs and found a window broken and glass shards in the entrance way. She looked through the broken window and saw three unknown men standing in the entrance way. She yelled at the suspects who quickly ran away. Ingleside Officers Smith and Ahern arrived and found the front entrance gate damaged and the lock broken. They also requested copies of the victim's security camera video, which were unavailable at the time. Report number: 190202471

3:35pm San Jose & Seneca Theft

A thirteen year old boy and his mother walked into Ingleside Station to report the theft of a phone. The young victim told Police Services Aid Bruce that he was robbed of his phone by two juveniles as he was walking on San Jose Avenue near Geneva. He said one of the suspects asked to use his phone to call a friend. Instead, the victim offered to dial the number himself and place the call on speaker so the suspect could hear the conversation. A man lost his cellphone to two thieves while riding a #14 bus home. The victim told Ingleside Officers Fyles and Tom that one suspect grabbed the phone from the victim's hand and, after being joined by a male companion, jumped off the bus and escaped by fleeing west on Bosworth Street. Ingleside Officers Watts and Peralta were on routine patrol when they spotted an older Honda Accord with illegally tinted windows blocking the view inside for the driver and front seat passenger. The passenger window was down and a large cloud of marijuana smoke was escaping from the interior. The officers pulled the driver over and determined he was unlicensed. He was also on probation from San Mateo County with a warrantless search condition for illegal possession of firearms. He was cited and released at the scene. Arrests:

11:25am Diamond Heights/Goldmine Aggravated Assault

A report of a “man pointing a gun at another person” prompted Ingleside Officers Carew, Peralta, Cvetovac, Murphy, Hardy, Mulligan, Phillips, Hauscarriague, and Najarro to respond. When they arrived the suspect and the victim were not at the scene but a witness, who was exercising his dog at a nearby dog park, gave the officers pictures of the suspect and his vehicle. Ingleside Officers Najarro, Phillips, and Hauscarriague searched the surrounding area for the suspect and found his vehicle parked on the 3800 block of 26th street. The officers waited and soon thereafter, the suspect exited a home and walked to his vehicle. The officers quickly placed him in custody and took possession of a Taser. He told the officers the other driver in the confrontation almost hit him and exited his vehicle with a baseball bat. That’s when the suspect took out his Taser and pointed it at the other driver. A computer check revealed he was on probation with a warrantless search condition out of San Francisco. He was employed as a dog walker and had keys to the home on 26th street who was a customer. A probation search of his home on Geneva Avenue turned up a .308 caliber rifle with a telescopic scope. He was transported to Ingleside Station and booked for aggravated assault and other crimes. 5:28pm Geneva/Santos Terrorist Threats

A belligerent Muni passenger was arrested for several serious crimes. The suspect boarded a bus at Velasco and Santos Street and was belligerent to several other passengers who would not abandon their seats. At one point, after swearing loudly at two passengers, he produced a pair of scissors and threatened to cut the victims. The Muni operator activated his emergency alarm and Ingleside Officers Demkowski and Smith caught up with the coach at Geneva and Prague where the suspect was arrested and eventually transported to the County Jail for booking. 2:10pm 4700 Blk. Mission Investigative Detention

Ingleside Officers Fogarty and Chan were dispatched to a report of a woman being sexually assaulted and being held against her will at a second floor apartment. The officers interviewed the witness and attempted to interview one of the residents of the apartment who was uncooperative. After consulting with the Department’s nighttime command staff it was decided the Department’s Tactical Team along with the Hostage Negotiation Team respond to the scene. A perimeter was established and team members negotiated with the occupants of the apartment to finally exit the building. The officers could find no evidence to support the allegations of assault and kidnapping and all residents were released without charges. Report number: 190195707

Are you someone who is interested in disaster preparedness and wants to help out your community while working hand in hand with Law Enforcement? If so, then the ALERT program is for you!



What is the ALERT Program?

The San Francisco Police Department Auxiliary Law Enforcement Response Team (ALERT) is a volunteer citizen disaster preparedness program. The ALERT program trains members of the public to assist Law Enforcement in essential tasks after a major disaster, and in other identified non-disaster activities. Such tasks may include: traffic control, foot patrols of business and residential areas, reporting criminal activity etc. Volunteers must be at least 16 years of age and must live, work, or attend school in San Francisco.

The ALERT program is modeled after, and works in partnership with, the San Francisco Fire Department Neighborhood Emergency Response Team (NERT) program.

Ways To Become An ALERT volunteer:

1. Graduate the SFFD NERT course (<http://sf-fire.org/neighborhood-emergency-response-team-nert>), or,
2. Graduate the SFPD Community Police Academy course (<https://sanfranciscopolice.org/community-police-academy>)
3. Pass a basic DOJ/FBI Background check.
4. Sign up for the next 8 hour ALERT new volunteer training class.

Bicycle and Pedestrian Safety Enforcement Operations Plan for San Francisco with OTS Grant

The San Francisco Police Department will conduct Traffic Safety Enforcement Operations on March 4th, 12th, 15th, 20th and 28th with a focus on bicycle and pedestrian safety. Over the past three years, the department has identified areas where significant numbers of pedestrian and bicycle-related collisions have occurred and responded by deploying additional officers to those areas in an effort to prevent deaths and injuries. Special attention will be given to Focus on the Five violations: speeding, making illegal turns, failing to stop for stop signs and red lights, failing to yield to pedestrians in cross walks, as well as any other dangerous violation.

San Francisco is committed to eliminating traffic deaths on our streets as part of Vision Zero SF. Vision Zero SF is our city's commitment to prioritize safe streets for everyone.

Bicycle and pedestrian fatalities are rising in California as more people use these non-motorized means of transportation. In 2016, California witnessed 867 pedestrians and 147 bicyclists killed, accounting for more than 28 percent of all traffic fatalities.

All riders are reminded to always wear a helmet – those under 18 years of age must wear helmets by law. Pedestrians should cross the street only in marked or unmarked crosswalks at corners. All motorists are reminded to be mindful of others who share the road.

San Francisco Police Make Arrest in Airport Theft Investigation

On February 17, 2019, at approximately 1:40PM, an unidentified suspect stole a case from a Terminal 3 baggage claim carousel at San Francisco International Airport (SFO). The case contained a Glock 9MM pistol, two magazines, 20 rounds of ammunition, two flashlights and a holster.

A member of SFPD's Taraval Police Station and a Night Investigations Sergeant recognized the suspect from a crime alert bulletin circulated within the Department. Investigators assigned to the SFPD Airport Bureau developed probable cause to obtain a search warrant for the suspect's residence.

On the morning of March 21, 2019, the search warrant was served at the suspect's residence on the 300 block of Delano Avenue in San Francisco. As a result of the search warrant, evidence linking the suspect to the theft was recovered.

The suspect, 48 year-old Dermot O'Sullivan was taken into custody near Ocean Avenue and San Jose Avenue. He was booked into San Mateo County Jail on the charges of burglary in the second degree and grand theft. A booking photo of O'Sullivan accompanies this news release.

San Francisco Police Make Arrest in Central District Homicide

On March 20, 2019 at approximately 1:45PM, officers from Central Police Station responded to Jefferson Street at Taylor Street regarding a stabbing. Dispatchers at the San Francisco Department of Emergency Management (SFDEM) provided responding officers with a suspect description. Members of the Central Station plainclothes team and Fisherman's Wharf foot beat detained the suspect at Taylor Street and North Point Street.

Additional officers located the victim, an adult male, on the sidewalk at Jefferson Street and Taylor Street. The victim was suffering from apparent stab wounds and aid was rendered by arriving San Francisco Fire Department personnel. The victim was transported to Zuckerberg San Francisco General Hospital (ZSFGH) where he later died.

Through the course of an investigation, the subject detained at Taylor and North Point was identified as the suspect and placed under arrest. Both the suspect and victim are known to frequent the Fisherman's Wharf area. Bruce Edward Penn, 56, of San Francisco was booked on the charges of murder and multiple counts of assault with a deadly weapon. Due to pending identification matters, his booking photo is not being released at this time.

San Francisco Police Make Arrests in Saturday Night Fillmore Shooting Homicide

On March 23, 2019 at approximately 8:40PM, San Francisco Police responded to the 1300 block of Fillmore Street regarding a shooting.

Upon arrival, officers located four persons suffering from apparent gunshot wounds. San Francisco Fire Department personnel responded to the scene and transported three adult victims. The fourth victim, Mister Dee C. Simmons, a 25 year-old male was pronounced dead at the scene. Of those transported by ambulance, a 27 year-old male remains listed in life threatening status. A 19 year-old male, resident of Westminster California and a 51 year-old male, San Francisco resident are listed in non-life threatening condition.

Two additional victims, a 51 year-old female, Alameda resident and a 25 year-old male, Concord resident (both with non-life threatening injuries) were transported to the hospital by private automobiles.

An investigation determined that Simmons, 25 year-old Sean Harrison (who was transported to the hospital by private auto) and Jamare Coats age 26, of San Francisco (who drove Harrison to the hospital) were involved the shooting. Harrison and Coats were later booked on homicide and firearms charges at San Francisco County Jail. Due to pending identification matters, booking photos are not being released at this time.

San Francisco Police Make Arrests in Illegal Cultivation & Money Laundering Investigation

In December 2018, officers at SFPD's Taraval Station began an investigation into illegal marijuana cultivation conspiracy, money laundering and possible human trafficking in the Taraval and Ingleside Police Districts.

On the morning of February 21, 2019 the Taraval Neighborhood Team (TNT), the SFPD Narcotics Detail, and the SFPD Special Victims Unit served seven simultaneous search warrants that resulted in the seizure of evidence from the following locations:

- 840 marijuana plants- 200 block of 40th Avenue
- 900 marijuana plants and 12 lbs. of wrapped marijuana in a suitcase- 3400 block of Judah Street
- 1,237 marijuana plants and \$11,000 in U.S. currency- 1900 block of 45th Avenue
- 435 marijuana plants- 2500 block of Ocean Avenue
- Financial information related to the operation- 200 block of Summit Way
- Financial information related to the criminal conspiracy seized- 4000 block of Alemany Boulevard

A total of 3,412 marijuana plants were seized in addition to three vehicles used in the criminal conspiracy. The investigation unearthed numerous fire code violations as the marijuana grow houses were found to have illegal electrical infrastructures, creating a fire hazard for the surrounding community.

The financial information seized from the above-mentioned locations was indicative of an ongoing money laundering operation used to fund and expand the criminal enterprise.

San Francisco Police Investigate Mission District Shooting *Suspect in Custody Following an Overnight Shooting Involving CHP Officers*

On March 25, 2019 at approximately 3:52PM, San Francisco Police officers from Mission Police Station responded to a call of a shooting on the 200 block of 13th Street.

Upon arrival, officers located the male victim, a 19 year-old San Francisco resident, in the lobby of a California Department of Corrections & Rehabilitation (CDCR) building. The victim was suffering from an apparent gunshot wound and was transported to a hospital. He remains in life threatening status. No CDCR personnel were involved in the incident.

A suspect was identified and information regarding the suspect and his vehicle- a silver Ford Focus sedan- was disseminated to law enforcement. On Monday night, SFPD investigators received word that the suspect vehicle had registered on an Automated License Plate Reader (ALPR) in Southern California. San Francisco Police investigators alerted California Highway Patrol (CHP) offices in Southern California that the suspect was likely in their patrol areas.

At approximately 3:10AM on Tuesday, March 26th, CHP officers in the Blythe area located the suspect vehicle abandoned on Interstate 10 near the Arizona border. A short time later, CHP officers located the suspect and were involved in an officer involved shooting (OIS). The suspect was taken into custody. No CHP officers were injured. The circumstances of the OIS are under investigation by the California Highway Patrol and the Riverside County Sheriff's Office.

San Francisco Police investigators will be coordinating with the Riverside County Sheriff and are expected to travel to Southern California to continue the investigation into Monday's shooting on 13th Street.

HOW TO REPORT GRAFFITI VANDALISM



The SFPD has learned that there are 5 major categories of graffiti which include:

- Communicative graffiti; Written to convey one's point of view. Often political.
- Hate crime graffiti. Written to instill fear with in real or perceived protected classes of people.
- Artistic graffiti. A character or nonverbal symbol often written repeatedly by an individual.
- Tagger graffiti. A written name or moniker repeatedly written by the same person or tagger. These pieces of graffiti are referred to as tags or graffiti tags.
- Gang graffiti. Written to mark gang territory. Written to create fear and intimidation toward rival gang members. Written to promote a gang or set of a gang.

Of these five different types of graffiti we know that the main source of graffiti vandalism in San Francisco is tagger graffiti. Exposing a graffiti taggers graffiti tag or moniker is a key to stopping them from committing more graffiti crimes.

The following steps should be taken when reporting graffiti crimes in progress:

- Call 911
- Pay particular attention to the Suspect's description and where they wrote their graffiti
- Follow up with the Officers and be ready to provide a statement and identify any detained person(s)
- If applicable provide a cost estimate for the damaged property

The following steps should be made when reporting cold graffiti cases with supporting evidence:

- Call (415)553-0123
- Provide full Suspect description or any other key details
- If applicable provide surveillance video
- Provide a cost estimate for the damaged property

The following steps should be made when reporting cases with less supporting evidence:

- Report online at <http://sanfranciscopolice.org/reportS>
- Include photos of the graffiti which can be uploaded through the report writing system
- Provide a cost estimate for the damaged property

To report graffiti on public property us the SF311 app.

The following Steps should be made to deter graffiti vandalism:

- Paint over graffiti quickly. If taggers know that their work won't last they are more likely to move to another location
- Use ample lighting. Taggers often use the cover of darkness to keep from being detected
- Set up surveillance cameras. Their presence act as a deterrent and they are useful in helping to identify taggers with prior arrests


