CHIEF'S REPORT

a. Update on significant policing efforts by Department members

Chief Fong discussed plans for the upcoming New Year's events. The Chief also talked about the Department's budget and announced that Chief Tabak will be giving a presentation on homicides on January 18th.

Commissioner Sparks asked about upcoming academy classes. Chief Fong stated that expanding the classes from 40 to 50 is doable.

Commissioner Sparks asked about a community policing plan or staffing plan. Chief Fong stated that those are two separate matters. The district station captains are preparing the community policing plan. The Chief also talked about 10B overtime and mandatory overtime and stated the key is to look at all overtime so the members are not too tired.

Commissioner Sparks asked about the video investigation. Chief Fong stated that the investigation is continuing and additional interviews are continuing this week.

Commissioner Veronese would like to know what the plan is to address the homicides in the city and stated that the Department should step up and come up with solutions. Chief Fong stated that in 2004 the Department put together a targeted enforcement program that targeted individuals who were responsible for a lot of the violence in the city and there was a decrease on black on black homicides have decreased. Chief Fong also stated the there is an enforcement component that is working with other city agencies on enforcement efforts.

Commissioner Campos asked about a community policing plan. Chief Fong stated that community policing is a philosophy in the department general order and not a specific program and that it is a district generated plan.
