I want to bring in front of the commission my concern and disgust of the commissioner Hamasaki's derogatory remarks against members of the community that are legally and peacefully exercising their constitutional rights as citizens and residents of San Francisco.

Such derogatory statements violate the ethical responsibility of a city official and they have no place in the City and County of San Francisco. This matter needs to be confronted and addressed urgently.

Calling an Asian father or any private citizen a member of an ultra right group (the Proud Boys) without credible evidence and with intent to disrupt and damage the reputation of the resident is sickening and ill intended. This is without a doubt a violation of the oath commissioner Hamasaki is supposed to obey and respect.

If a police officer made such statements, most likely than not, Commissioner Hamasaki would demand that the officer be fired, even if the comments were said in a private text message. The Supreme Court has established "The Square Corners" Doctrine which means that government agencies must conduct themselves with compunction and integrity and not in such a way as to achieve or preserve any kind of advantage over a member of the public.

Therefore Commissioner Hamasaki cannot use his office as an excuse to commit unethical and probably unlawful acts against a private citizen, and is the duty of the commission to safeguard the citizens of the City of San Francisco of such gross disregard shown by commissioner Hamasaki.
