Wednesday Feb 6, 2019

On February 6<sup>th</sup>, 2019, Mayor London Breed and City Administrator Naomi Kelley are presenting the 11<sup>th</sup> Annual San Francisco Neighborhood Empowerment Network (NEN) Awards at City Hall.

I am humbled and honored to receive probably the most prestigious award any government employee could receive: The Most Empowering City Employee of the Year award, joining the ranks of esteemed past award recipients such as DPW Superintendent Mohammed Nuru, SFPD's Captain Erica Arteseros. The Clean Team's Sandra Zuniaga, SFPD's Captain Joe McFadden, Assistant City Attorney Victoria Weatherford, and others.

Abraham Lincoln famously said: "Nearly all can stand adversity, but if you want to test people's character, give them power." What he was saying to us is that character is forged in the everyday acts of power that are in service of a cause greater than ourselves and not in service of and for ourselves. ## Featured Ingleside Officers of the Month **Ofc Archilla & Ofc Lustenberger**



**Officers Mark Lustenberger and Luis Archilla:**

**For the past decade, these officers have worked in uniform and street crimes teams at Ingleside Station and have been highly successful in utilizing patrol and investigative techniques that have led to numerous successful arrests and prosecutions.**

**In January of 2019 alone, these officers have made two exceptional arrests of violent felons which made the streets of the Ingleside and all of San Francisco safer.**

**On January 2<sup>nd</sup>, 2019, a citywide broadcast alerted officers to be on the lookout for a murder suspect from the Tenderloin neighborhood along with the license plate of the vehicle he was driving. Officers proactively recorded the plate, ran a records query through a law enforcement database, and set out to locate the suspect. When they located the vehicle without the suspect inside, these officers coordinated a perimeter and arrested the suspect when he exited his residence.**

**On January 19<sup>th</sup>, 2019, these officers heard a broadcast of a robbery of a phone that occurred in the Taraval police district. These officers utilized digital GPS on the device to locate the suspect. When they confronted the suspect, a foot-chase ensued and the suspect was apprehended. The suspect was then identified as the same person who was wanted for a separate carjacking and the horrific burglary and assault of the 88-year-old grandmother from Visitacion Valley.**

**These are just two examples of the exceptional work that these officers are known for. We are lucky to have them here at Ingleside Station. For this, they are Ingleside Station's Featured Officers of the Month for February, 2019.**

#### **Robbery**

Ingleside Officers responded to the call of someone being threatened with a knife. The caller gave a description of the suspect and responding units detained him not too far from the scene. The victim reported that he was approached by the suspect who demanded all his money while holding a knife. The victim decided that today wasn't going to be the day he was robbed, so he grabbed a big flashlight from his vehicle and told the suspect to leave him alone. The suspect then fled on foot, without any of the victim's belongings. The victim was not injured during this incident. The suspect was arrested and charged appropriately. Case # 190086394

Ingleside Officers responded to the report of an attempted carjacking. The victim reported that 4 suspects robbed him of his cell phone while he was seated in his vehicle. One suspect produced an unknown object and placed it to the side of the victim, demanding all his belongings. The suspects made off with the victim's cell phone which was later recovered. Ingleside Officers responded to the call of an assault aboard a Muni Bus. Officers met with the pregnant female victim who told them that a female suspect was swearing at her, and threw a container of hair gel at the victim striking her in her right shoulder. The suspect then attacked the victim and started punching her multiple times knocking her to the floor. The suspect began to punch the victim in the stomach and stated that she was going to kill the victim and her unborn baby. Witnesses helped pull the suspect off of the victim and intervened. The suspect then fled the bus on foot before units arrived. Additional responding officers scoured the area and located the suspect aboard another Muni Bus and took her into custody. The victim positively identified the suspect as her attacker. The female suspect was booked on several charges including aggravated assault and attempted homicide. The victim was transported to SFGH for medical treatment. Case # 190077412

## Auxiliary Law Enforcement Response Team (ALERT)



Are you someone who is interested in disaster preparedness and wants to help out your community while working hand in hand with Law Enforcement? If so, then the ALERT program is for you!



## What is the ALERT Program?

The San Francisco Police Department Auxiliary Law Enforcement Response Team (ALERT) is a volunteer citizen disaster preparedness program. The ALERT program trains members of the public to assist Law Enforcement in essential tasks after a major disaster, and in other identified non-disaster activities. Such tasks may include: traffic control, foot patrols of business and residential areas, reporting criminal activity etc. Volunteers must be at least 16 years of age and must live, work, or attend school in San Francisco.

The ALERT program is modeled after, and works in partnership with, the San Francisco Fire Department Neighborhood Emergency Response Team (NERT) program.

### Pathways to ALERT membership:

1. Complete NERT training and receive certification. To register for NERT training courses, please visit [www.sfgov.org/sfnert](http://www.sfgov.org/sfnert). Once NERT Certified, forward a copy of your NERT ID card to the ALERT program at [sfpdalert@sfgov.org](mailto:sfpdalert@sfgov.org). After clearing our background check, you are eligible for ALERT training.
2. If you are an SFPD Community Police Academy graduate, you are eligible for ALERT training after clearing our background check.

#### ABOUT PROPOSITION E

Last November, the voters passed Proposition E by a 75% majority thereby earmarking 1.5% of the City's 14% Hotel Tax for arts and cultural programming. The legislation increases extant city support for GFTA, the Cultural Equity Endowment, and Cultural Centers. It also includes funding for new priorities, such as a fund to support cultural districts (administered by the Mayor's Office of Housing and Community Development) and a newly established Arts Impact Endowment to address emerging needs in the arts and culture sector. The SFAC and GFTA have launched a public engagement process to help create a Cultural Services Allocation Plan to help guide how the new Arts Impact Endowment funds will be spent over the next five years.





Starting on February 11, 2019, morning weekday BART trains will start one hour later for vital repairs and critical earthquake safety work. Alternative bus service will run between 3:45 am and 6:00 am.

Roughly 2,900 passengers enter the BART system during that first hour of service. Over 2,400 of those riders begin their trips in the East Bay with 64% disembarking at downtown San Francisco stations.

First hour BART riders surveyed during extensive outreach in the Spring of 2018 guided the development of a robust alternative bus service plan between the 4:00 am - 5:00 am window.

The alternative service plan creates 14 new express bus lines that will run from 3:45 am until 6:00 am. This includes 7 Transbay bus routes, 5 East Bay routes and 2 San Francisco/Peninsula routes. BART is partnering with 8 Bay Area bus agencies to operate this network. All fares between express bus stops will be the same as, or less than, current BART fares for the same trips. Train service will start at approximately 5 am. Check the schedule at [www.bart.gov](http://www.bart.gov).



BART trains will start running an hour later each weekday at 5:00 am, beginning on February 11, 2019, so that a vital retrofit of the Transbay Tube and other necessary system upgrades can be performed.

To install the steel lining and make other systemwide upgrades, our crews will need extra time to be in the trackway overnight. Opening an hour later will speed up these projects by at least 25% and provide a minimum 12% cost savings.

## Parking Options

Because BART stations won't open until 5 am, current parking payment methods will not be available for Early Bird Express riders. There will be two options to allow these riders to continue to pay for parking. The first is the Pay by Smart Phone App. BART will launch the new single sign-on app this fall with the parking payment feature expected to be available for early morning parkers only between 3:45 am and 5:15 am beginning February 2019.

For those who prefer to pay by cash, day passes will be available for advance purchase by mail or at the Lake Merritt and Embarcadero Clipper Card Office customer service centers.

### What Work is Being Done?

The Transbay Tube is made up of a giant concrete liner and an outer steel shell. To address concerns of flooding in the Tube, BART crews will install an inner steel lining designed to minimize leakage in the event of a very large earthquake on the Hayward or San Andreas faults. Workers will also upgrade the water pumping system to allow more time to safely evacuate riders and make necessary repairs if a large quake causes damage. Upgrades to other vital parts of the system will also be made to ensure safe and reliable service.



### How Long will the Later Weekday Start Time Last?

We anticipate the Transbay Tube retrofit work will last approximately 3.5 years.







San Francisco Superior Court is seeking volunteers for the Civil Grand Jury. The Civil Grand Jury is the “watchdog” for the City and County of San Francisco. The Civil Grand Jury investigates the operations of City government, including officials, departments, and agencies. Each year, the Civil Grand Jury issues reports based on its findings. Those reports are heard before the Board of Supervisors.

The Civil Grand Jury will serve from July 1, 2019 through June 30, 2020. The application deadline is May 17, 2019.

#### **Eligibility Requirements:**

- 18 years of age or older and a United States citizen.
- San Francisco resident for at least the past 12 months.
- Able to commit time consistently throughout the term.
- Desire to work together with other committed San Franciscans.

## SAN FRANCISCO CIVIL GRAND JURY FACT SHEET AND SELECTION TIMELINE

### **What is the Civil Grand Jury?**

- As required by the California Constitution, the Civil Grand Jury is a “watchdog” that investigates the operations of the City and County government, including its officers, departments, and agencies.
- The Civil Grand Jury is 19 members randomly drawn from a pool of applicants who volunteer to serve for a one year term.

### **How does it Work?**

- Each Civil Grand Jury determines, by majority vote, which issues related to the government of the City and County of San Francisco to investigate. Typically, the Jury divides itself into committees, which carry out the investigations and write the reports.
- To do the investigations and write its reports, Civil Grand Jurors review records and financial documents; interview City and County department heads, elected officials, and staff; and visit government facilities. The entire Jury must vote to approve reports.
- After the Presiding Judge of the Superior Court reviews the reports to ensure they meet legal requirements, the reports are issued. The affected departments are required by law to respond to each finding and recommendation contained in the reports.
- The Board of Supervisors holds a public hearing on each report. The Civil Grand Jury presents the report, and each affected department responds. The Board of Supervisors then issues its own response.

### **When?**

- The entire Civil Grand Jury meets once per week, generally in the late afternoon. Subcommittees meet as needed. Most of the Jury’s work takes place during regular business hours.
- Jurors must be able to serve the entire term, from July 1 through June 30. Jurors must be able to commit time consistently throughout the term.

### **Who is Eligible?**

- In order to volunteer to be considered for the Civil Grand Jury, you must be a United States citizen; at least 18 years of age; have lived in San Francisco for at least the past one year; have no felony convictions; and have the ability to communicate in English.

### **How do I Apply?**

- Applications may be downloaded from <http://civilgrandjury.sfgov.org/join.html>, or you may pick one up at San Francisco Superior Court, 400 McAllister Street, Room 007. The application deadline is on May 17, 2019.
- The most qualified applicants will be invited to attend a mandatory informational session on May 21 or May 30, 2019.
- Selection by a panel of Superior Court Judges will be held on June 7, 2019.
- The 2019 – 2020 Civil Grand Jury will be trained on June 10, 17, 18, and 24, 2019.
- The 2019 – 2020 Civil Grand Jury takes office on July 1, 2019.

## HOW TO REPORT GRAFFITI VANDALISM



The SFPD has learned that there are 5 major categories of graffiti which include:

- Communicative graffiti; Written to convey one's point of view. Often political.
- Hate crime graffiti. Written to instill fear with in real or perceived protected classes of people.
- Artistic graffiti. A character or nonverbal symbol often written repeatedly by an individual.
- Tagger graffiti. A written name or moniker repeatedly written by the same person or tagger. These pieces of graffiti are referred to as tags or graffiti tags.
- Gang graffiti. Written to mark gang territory. Written to create fear and intimidation toward rival gang members. Written to promote a gang or set of a gang.

Of these five different types of graffiti we know that the main source of graffiti vandalism in San Francisco is tagger graffiti. Exposing a graffiti taggers graffiti tag or moniker is a key to stopping them from committing more graffiti crimes.

The following steps should be taken when reporting graffiti crimes in progress:

- Call 911
- Pay particular attention to the Suspect's description and where they wrote their graffiti
- Follow up with the Officers and be ready to provide a statement and identify any detained person(s)
- If applicable provide a cost estimate for the damaged property

The following steps should be made when reporting cold graffiti cases with supporting evidence:

- Call (415)553-0123
- Provide full Suspect description or any other key details
- If applicable provide surveillance video
- Provide a cost estimate for the damaged property

The following steps should be made when reporting cases with less supporting evidence:

- Report online at <http://sanfranciscopolice.org/reportS>
- Include photos of the graffiti which can be uploaded through the report writing system
- Provide a cost estimate for the damaged property

To report graffiti on public property us the SF311 app.

The following Steps should be made to deter graffiti vandalism:

- Paint over graffiti quickly. If taggers know that their work won't last they are more likely to move to another location
- Use ample lighting. Taggers often use the cover of darkness to keep from being detected
- Set up surveillance cameras. Their presence act as a deterrent and they are useful in helping to identify taggers with prior arrests


