Take MUNI's No. 71 line (outbound) and transfer at 6th Avenue at Lincoln Way to the No. 44 line (O'Shaughnessy). Disabled placard parking spaces are available in the Concourse Parking Garage (enter at 10<sup>th</sup> Avenue and Fulton Street) and on John F. Kennedy Drive. There are accessible parking spaces (disabled-designated) available in front of the Legion. Accessible seating for persons with disabilities (including those using wheelchairs) will be available. For Telecommunication Device for the Deaf (TDD), the Museums use the California Relay Service.
