RESOLVED, That the Board of Trustees of the Corporation of the Fine Arts Museums does hereby set the number of Trustees at Forty-Three (43) until such number is changed by this Board.

Upon motion, duly seconded, there was no discussion among Trustees. There was no public comment. Trustees voted unanimously to adopt the above resolution as **Board Resolution 1830.**

Setting the Number of Executive Committee Positions

Trustee Zanze proposed the following resolution setting the number of Executive Committee positions:

WHEREAS, On January 30, 2013, the Fine Arts Museums of San Francisco Bylaws were amended to provide for a variable number of Executive Committee members; and

WHEREAS, The amendment stated that the authorized number of Executive Committee Members shall be at least thirteen, the exact number to be set by the Board of Trustees from time to time; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, That the Board of Trustees of the Fine Arts Museums of San Francisco does hereby set the number of Executive Committee members at fifteen (15) until such number is changed by this Board.

IV. Report of the President

President Wilsey announced a change in staff support for the Board of Trustees, noting that Megan Bourne, who has served as Executive Secretary to the Board of Trustees, will move into the role of Chief of Staff. Stephen Bowden will serve as Manager of Board Relations. He has extensive familiarity with many trustees from previous employment and, more recently at FAMSF, in the roles of Executive Assistant to the Director of Development, Deputy Director and Chief Curator.
