III. Report of the Nominating Committee

Deferral of election, re-election, and retirement of current officers and Trustees pending finalization of COFAM bylaws

Lisa Zanze, Chair of the Nominating Committee, proposed the following resolution:

WHEREAS, the Corporation of the Fine Arts Museums is considering proposed revisions to that corporation's bylaws and has yet to finalize the revised bylaws, including provisions affecting the election of that corporation's officers and Trustees;

WHEREAS, the Fine Arts Museums of San Francisco Trustees are designated to serve on the Corporation of the Fine Arts Museum's Board of Trustees;

WHEREAS, the Corporation of the Fine Arts Museums believes that the bylaws will be finalized and approved in the next month or two; now therefore be it

RESOLVED, That the Board of Trustees of the Fine Arts Museums of San Francisco does hereby postpone the election, re-election, and retirement of current officers and Trustees and extend the terms of its current officers and Trustees, as needed, until the Corporation of the Fine Arts Museums' bylaws are finalized and approved, but in no event later than August 1, 2016.

Upon motion, duly seconded, there was discussion among Trustees. President Wilsey reiterated that the deferral of elections is due to insufficient time to notice bylaws changes. There was no public testimony. Trustees voted unanimously to adopt the above resolution as **Board Resolution 1824**.

Resolution Setting the Number of Trustee Positions

Trustee Zanze continued by proposing the following resolution:

WHEREAS, The San Francisco Charter, Section 5.105, provides for a variable number of Trustees; and

WHEREAS, The Charter sets the number of Trustees at no more than sixty-two, with the exact number to be set by the Board of Trustees from time to time; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, That the Board of Trustees of the Fine Arts Museums of San Francisco does hereby set the number of Trustees at 45 until such number is changed by this Board.

Upon motion, duly seconded, there was no discussion among Trustees. There was no public testimony. Trustees voted unanimously to adopt the above resolution as **Board Resolution 1825**.

IV. Report of the President

Approval of the Minutes

Upon motion, duly seconded, there was discussion among Trustees to change the roll call section of the draft minutes (Trustee Low was not in attendance). There were no comments from the public. The revised minutes of the April 19, 2016 meeting of the Board of Trustees, having been delivered in advance to all trustees, were unanimously approved.

Report of the May 11, 2016 Acquisitions Committee Meeting

George Hecksher, Vice President for Collections and Chair of the Acquisitions Committee reviewed two (2) purchases and twelve (12) funded purchases. In reviewing the two hundred and six (206) gifts, Mr. Hecksher called on Karin Breuer, Curator in Charge of the Achenbach Foundation for Graphic Arts, to discuss a gift of artists' books. Ms. Breuer noted that three of the books were on view in the board room, and others will be on view in Gallery F at the Legion of Honor through the summer. Mr. Hecksher called on Jill D' Alessandro, Curator of Textile Arts, to review a gift of 55 designer and couture garments, two of which were on view in the board room.

Mr. Hecksher briefly reviewed a selection of thirty-nine (39) objects recommended for first-step deaccession, and one hundred nineteen (119) objects recommended for second-step deaccession, noting there were no objects of great importance or value proposed for deaccession.

The following resolution was proposed:

RESOLVED, That the Board of Trustees of the Fine Arts Museums of San Francisco does hereby approve the May 11, 2016 report of the Acquisitions Committee of the Fine Arts Museums Foundation, including approving the works of art acquired through purchase and donation as gifts to the Fine Arts Museums of San Francisco from the Fine Arts Museums Foundation, approving first and second step deaccessioning.

Upon motion, duly seconded, there was no discussion among Trustees. There was no public testimony. Trustees voted unanimously to adopt the above resolution as **Board Resolution 1826**. The full report of the Acquisitions Committee is attached to these minutes as **Appendix I**.

V. Report of the Acting Director

Transferring Funds in the Admission Fund for the Fiscal Year 2016–2017

Mr. Benefield, Acting Director, proposed the following resolution:

RESOLVED, That the Board of Trustees of the Fine Arts Museums of San Francisco does hereby authorize the Controller of the City and County of San Francisco to transfer monthly excess revenue over monthly admission operating expenses in the Admission Fund (2S CRF RPD) Index Code 615001 to Project PFAADM, Index Code 615001 on a monthly basis for the Fiscal Year 2016–2017; and, be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That the funds in Project PFAADM are to be used to reimburse the Corporation of the Fine Arts Museums for expenses incurred on behalf of the Museums.

Upon motion, duly seconded, there was no discussion among Trustees. There was no public testimony. Trustees voted unanimously to adopt the above resolution as **Board Resolution 1827**.
