A. POLICY SUBCOMMITTEE Member Kimura

Committee Member Kimura gave an update on the work of the policy Subcommittee, including the recommended changes to the Committee's site visit requirements and an update on the Navigation Center Workgroup. The Committee had a discussion on which Standards they thought the Committee should monitor during visits to the Navigation Centers and decided to remove Standard 5 from the list of excluded Standards.

Explanatory document: Navigation Center Standards of Care

Proposed Action: Approve Navigation Centers Standards of Care with edits

Public comment: Charles Pitts stated that if the Committee will not monitor compliance with Standard 19 at the Navigation Centers, it should only apply in cases where clients are couples. He stated that that Standard 19 was put in because shelters were place mats right next to each other and were telling clients that they had to sleep together.

III. NEW BUSINESS

A. HSH STRATEGIC FRAMEWORK Committee Member Ward 20 min Committee Member Ward presented the HSH Strategic Framework, including information on how the framework was developed with community input, that the goal of the framework to reduce homelessness and how much of the budget

is for housing subsidies and continued support for individuals who have made it through the systems.

Public comment: Charles Pitts shared his concerns about whether Navigation Centers would stick to their original program model, the ONE system and the availability of SROs and supportive housing in San Francisco.

Public comment: Elea Concha stated that she has had difficulty getting ADA accommodations and IHSS services through San Francisco's shelter system.

 and Supportive Housing (DHSH), which included reports about shelter occupancy.

C. STANDARD OF CARE STAFF REPORT Committee Staff 10 min

Committee staff reviewed the October 2017, Standard of Care Staff report. Committee

Staffer Jeff Simbe stated that he was working with DHSH and other stakeholders to set
up a meeting of the Navigation Workgroup sometime in January. Mr. Simbe also stated
that Committee members could tour the 16th and Mission Navigation Center on the 1st

Friday of every month.

Public comment: Charles Pitts stated his concerns about the Navigation Centers not implementing the shelter grievance policy.

Public comment: Elea Concha asked if shelter employees were required to have ADA training.

Public comment: Nancy Cross stated that her concerns that the shelter grievance process does not include fair administrative hearings that allow for the presentation of oral evidence by clients.
