#### C. DEPT OF HOMELESSNESS AND SUPPORTIVE HOUSING DISCUSSION

HSH 5 min

Member Rachowicz shared the HSH vacancy report. Access has improved since last month's meeting. Previously, intakes were paused if there were two or three positive cases of COVID-19. Based on DPH guidance, HSH is no longer pausing intakes for outbreaks. Shelters have some ability to segregate clients on-site. And dedicated overflow COVID segregation sites are available when needed. Civic Center is not near theoretical capacity at present because several rooms are under repair. A new Vehicle Triage Center near Candlestick is full, with 57 vehicles in it. Dolores Street/Jazzi House and the Bryant site are on track to be opened in March. It is hoped that the Bryant site will serve as a welcoming alternative for the TGNC community. Note, the Bryant winter walk-in site is currently open.
