

NEW SHELTER PRIORITIZATION POLICY

- 1. The placement process is as follows:
 - a. Families staying in a place where they are being physically or sexually abused and are unable to access a Domestic Violence Shelter (existing process, no change)
 - b. "Verified unsheltered" as confirmed by SFHOT / Compass staff, including:
 - i. Long-term shelter lengths of stay in congregate settings:
 - First Friendship (congregate mats) families whose length of stay is 60+ days. Given the challenges of congregate with mats stays, a family whose length of stay exceeded 60 days will have its stay multiplied by a factor of 1.5, in order to arrive at an adjusted length of stay that is then used to determine placement prioritization.
 - 2. Hamilton Families (60-day congregate beds) whose length of stay is 100+ days
 - 3. Adults who will be reunited with child(ren) for whom the adult has documented 50% custody and reunification will occur within seven (7) days of shelter placement.
 - 4. Adults who are pregnant in shelters or navigation centers by verified lengths of homelessness.
 - c. No change to the following existing practice:
