COMPLAINT

Complainant Michael Petrelis ("Complainant") alleges that Supervisor Rafael Mandelman ("Respondent"), violated the Sunshine Ordinance by failing to respond to Complainant's requests in a timely and complete manner.

COMPLAINANT FILES COMPLAINT

Complainant filed this complaint with the Task Force on October 22, 2019.

JURISDICTION

Respondent is subject to the Sunshine Ordinance and the California Public Records Act ("CPRA"). Respondent does not dispute jurisdiction.

APPLICABLE STATUTORY SECTION(S)

Section 67 of the San Francisco Administrative Code:

- Section 67.21 governs responses to a public records request in general.
- Section 67.29-5 sets forth requirements for certain City officials with respect to their calendars..

Cal. Government Code (CPRA)

- Section 6253 sets forth the general requirements for the production of records.

APPLICABLE CASE LAW

- *City of San Jose v. Superior Court* (2017) 2 Cal.5th 608 (holding that when a city employee uses a personal account to communicate about public business, the writings may be subject to disclosure under the CPRA).

BACKGROUND

On October 7, 2019, Complainant filed an immediate disclosure request with Respondent, seeking:

1. Your calendar from January 1 through October 7, 2019.
2. All of your texts and emails, sent or received, from September 1 through October 7, 2019.”

The following day, Respondent’s office sent an email to Complainant, stating that “[b]ecause our office needs to consult with another city department regarding your request and, due to the voluminous nature of the materials requested, we are unable to provide a response by the end of the day today.” Respondent’s office stated that it would respond further by October 21, 2019.

Complainant subsequently sent emails to Respondent’s office, asking for the production of documents on a rolling basis and inquiring as to the status of his requests. On October 15, 2019, Respondent’s office asked Complainant whether, with respect to emails, Complainant might narrow his request by providing search terms. Complainant provided search terms to Respondent’s office on October 16 and October 17.

On October 23, 2019, Respondent provided calendars for the period of January 1, 2019 through March 31, 2019. Respondent’s office further stated that “texts and emails spanning the period of September 1, 2019 – October 7, 2019, is voluminous and requires that we carefully review the calendar items and communications individually for applicable redactions to personal, privileged, and/or personnel information.” Respondent committed to provide documents on a rolling basis. On October 30, 2019, Respondent sent Complainant calendars for the period of April 1, 2019 through June 30, 2019.

On October 31, 2019, the clerk of the Task Force sent an email to Complainant asking whether, in light of the documents produced thus far, Complainant desired to continue to pursue the complaint with the Task Force. In response, the Complainant stated: “I have received several months of calendar entries from Mandelman’s office but no emails and texts so, yes, I wish to continue the complaint process with the SOTF.”

On November 12, 2019, Respondent provided Complainant with responsive calendars for the remaining period, from July 1, 2019 through October 7, 2019. A representative of Respondent went on to state that “[o]ur office is prioritizing and working diligently to process your further requests for emails and text messages, and will provide additional responsive records on a rolling basis as soon as they are reviewed and available, without delay.”

**CHAPTER 67, SAN FRANCISCO ADMINISTRATIVE CODE (SUNSHINE
ORDINANCE)**

**SEC. 67.21. PROCESS FOR GAINING ACCESS TO PUBLIC RECORDS;
ADMINISTRATIVE APPEALS**

(a) Every person having custody of any public record or public information, as defined herein, (hereinafter referred to as a custodian of a public record) shall, at normal times and during normal and reasonable hours of operation, without unreasonable delay, and without requiring an appointment, permit the public record, or any segregable portion of a record, to be inspected and examined by any person and shall furnish one copy thereof upon payment of a reasonable copying charge, not to exceed the lesser of the actual cost or ten cents per page.

(b) A custodian of a public record shall, as soon as possible and within ten days following receipt of a request for inspection or copy of a public record, comply with such request. Such request may be delivered to the office of the custodian by the requester orally or in writing by fax, postal delivery, or e-mail. If the custodian believes the record or information requested is not a public record or is exempt, the custodian shall justify withholding any record by demonstrating, in writing as soon as possible and within ten days following receipt of a request, that the record in question is exempt under express provisions of this ordinance.

(c) A custodian of a public record shall assist a requester in identifying the existence, form, and nature of any records or information maintained by, available to, or in the custody of the custodian, whether or not the contents of those records are exempt from disclosure and shall, when requested to do so, provide in writing within seven days following receipt of a request, a statement as to the existence, quantity, form and nature of records relating to a particular subject or questions with enough specificity to enable a requester to identify records in order to make a request under (b). A custodian of any public record, when not in possession of the record requested, shall assist a requester in directing a request to the proper office or staff person.

(d) If the custodian refuses, fails to comply, or incompletely complies with a request described in (b), the person making the request may petition the supervisor of records for a determination whether the record requested is public. The supervisor of records shall inform the petitioner, as soon as possible and within 10 days, of its determination whether the record requested, or any part of the record requested, is public. Where requested by the petition, and where otherwise desirable, this determination shall be in writing. Upon the determination by the supervisor of records that the record is public, the supervisor of records shall immediately order the custodian of the public record to comply with the person's request. If the custodian refuses or fails to comply with any such order within 5 days, the supervisor of records shall notify the district attorney or the attorney general who shall take whatever measures she or he deems necessary and appropriate to insure compliance with the provisions of this ordinance.

(e) If the custodian refuses, fails to comply, or incompletely complies with a request described in (b) above or if a petition is denied or not acted on by the supervisor of public records, the person making the request may petition the Sunshine Task Force for a determination whether the record requested is public. The Sunshine Task Force shall inform the petitioner, as soon as possible and within 2 days after its next meeting but in no case later than 45 days from when a petition in writing is received, of its determination whether the record requested, or any

part of the record requested, is public. Where requested by the petition, and where otherwise desirable, this determination shall be in writing. Upon the determination that the record is public, the Sunshine Task Force shall immediately order the custodian of the public record to comply with the person's request. If the custodian refuses or fails to comply with any such order within 5 days, the Sunshine Task Force shall notify the district attorney or the attorney general who may take whatever measures she or he deems necessary to insure compliance with the provisions of this ordinance. The Board of Supervisors and the City Attorney's office shall provide sufficient staff and resources to allow the Sunshine Task Force to fulfill its duties under this provision. Where requested by the petition, the Sunshine Task Force may conduct a public hearing concerning the records request denial. An authorized representative of the custodian of the public records requested shall attend any hearing and explain the basis for its decision to withhold the records requested.

(f) The administrative remedy provided under this article shall in no way limit the availability of other administrative remedies provided to any person with respect to any officer or employee of any agency, executive office, department or board; nor shall the administrative remedy provided by this section in any way limit the availability of judicial remedies otherwise available to any person requesting a public record. If a custodian of a public record refuses or fails to comply with the request of any person for inspection or copy of a public record or with an administrative order under this section, the superior court shall have jurisdiction to order compliance.

(g) In any court proceeding pursuant to this article there shall be a presumption that the record sought is public, and the burden shall be upon the custodian to prove with specificity the exemption which applies.

(h) On at least an annual basis, and as otherwise requested by the Sunshine Ordinance Task Force, the supervisor of public records shall prepare a tally and report of every petition brought before it for access to records since the time of its last tally and report. The report shall at least identify for each petition the record or records sought, the custodian of those records, the ruling of the supervisor of public records, whether any ruling was overturned by a court and whether orders given to custodians of public records were followed. The report shall also summarize any court actions during that period regarding petitions the Supervisor has decided. At the request of the Sunshine Ordinance Task Force, the report shall also include copies of all rulings made by the supervisor of public records and all opinions issued.

(i) The San Francisco City Attorney's office shall act to protect and secure the rights of the people of San Francisco to access public information and public meetings and shall not act as legal counsel for any city employee or any person having custody of any public record for purposes of denying access to the public. The City Attorney may publish legal opinions in response to a request from any person as to whether a record or information is public. All communications with the City Attorney's Office with regard to this ordinance, including petitions, requests for opinion, and opinions shall be public records.

(j) Notwithstanding the provisions of this section, the City Attorney may defend the City or a City Employee in litigation under this ordinance that is actually filed in court to any extent required by the City Charter or California Law.

(k) Release of documentary public information, whether for inspection of the original or by providing a copy, shall be governed by the California Public Records Act (Government Code Section 6250 et seq.) in particulars not addressed by this ordinance and in accordance with the enhanced disclosure requirements provided in this ordinance.

(l) Inspection and copying of documentary public information stored in electronic form shall be made available to the person requesting the information in any form requested which is available to or easily generated by the department, its officers or employees, including disk, tape, printout or monitor at a charge no greater than the cost of the media on which it is duplicated. Inspection of documentary public information on a computer monitor need not be allowed where the information sought is necessarily and unseparably intertwined with information not subject to disclosure under this ordinance. Nothing in this section shall require a department to program or reprogram a computer to respond to a request for information or to release information where the release of that information would violate a licensing agreement or copyright law.

SEC. 67.29-5. CALENDARS OF CERTAIN OFFICIALS.

(a) The Mayor, City Attorney, Treasurer, Assessor-Recorder, District Attorney, Public Defender, Sheriff, every member of the Board of Supervisors, and every Department Head shall keep or cause to be kept a daily calendar wherein is recorded the time and place of each meeting or event attended by that official, either in person or by teleconference or other electronic means, with the exclusion of purely personal or social events at which no City business is discussed and that do not take place at City Offices or at the offices or residences of people who do substantial business with or are otherwise substantially financially affected by actions of the City. For meetings not otherwise publicly recorded, the calendar shall include a general statement of issues discussed. Such calendars shall be public records and shall be available to any requester three business days subsequent to the calendar entry date.

(b) For meetings or events with ten or fewer attendees, the calendar shall also identify the individual(s) present and organization(s) represented at the meeting or event if known by the official, unless the official is aware that the information would reveal the identity of a confidential whistleblower, would interfere with an individual's right to petition government where the individual has sought and been assured confidentiality, would disclose the attendance of members or representatives of a labor organization at a meeting to discuss matters within the scope of representation, as that term is defined in California Government Code Section 3504, would reveal personnel information not subject to disclosure, or is otherwise exempt from disclosure under State and local law.

(c) At any meeting or event with ten or fewer attendees, officials subject to subsection (a) of this Section 67.29-5 shall attempt to identify names of attendees present, and the organizations they represent; provided that an official shall not require any attendees to identify themselves, unless the official is aware that those attendees are campaign consultants registered with the Ethics Commission under Campaign and Governmental Conduct Code Article I, Chapter 5; lobbyists registered with the Ethics Commission under Campaign and Governmental Conduct

Code Article II, Chapter 1; permit consultants registered with the Ethics Commission under Campaign and Governmental Conduct Code Article III, Chapter 4; Developers of Major Projects, as defined in Campaign and Governmental Conduct Code Section 3.510, if the Major Project is discussed at the meeting or event; and employees or representatives of any entity that has received a grant from or entered a contract with any City department within the previous 12 months. The official has no duty to ascertain whether any attendees fall into these categories. Within three business days after a meeting or event subject to this subsection (c), the official shall update the daily calendar to include the names of the attendees and organizations identified by or known to the official.

(d) For the purpose of calculating the total number of attendees at a meeting or event under subsections (b) and (c), an official shall not include himself or herself.

(e) The obligations imposed under subsections (b) and (c), and the obligations imposed upon members of the Board of Supervisors under subsection (a), shall not apply to meetings or events where City business is discussed only incidentally; to unplanned, casual conversations with residents; to campaign-related meetings, events; and appearances; or to meetings or events where all attendees are employees or officers in the official's City department, which for members of the Board of Supervisors shall mean that all attendees are members of the Board of Supervisors, legislative aides, or employees of the Office of the Clerk of the Board. Officials are not in violation of subsections (b) or (c), and members of the Board of Supervisors are not in violation of subsection (a), if they have made a good faith effort to comply with their obligations thereunder.

CALIFORNIA GOVERNMENT CODE (CPRA)**SEC. 6253.**

(a) Public records are open to inspection at all times during the office hours of the state or local agency and every person has a right to inspect any public record, except as hereafter provided. Any reasonably segregable portion of a record shall be available for inspection by any person requesting the record after deletion of the portions that are exempted by law.

(b) Except with respect to public records exempt from disclosure by express provisions of law, each state or local agency, upon a request for a copy of records that reasonably describes an identifiable record or records, shall make the records promptly available to any person upon payment of fees covering direct costs of duplication, or a statutory fee if applicable. Upon request, an exact copy shall be provided unless impracticable to do so.

(c) Each agency, upon a request for a copy of records, shall, within 10 days from receipt of the request, determine whether the request, in whole or in part, seeks copies of disclosable public records in the possession of the agency and shall promptly notify the person making the request of the determination and the reasons therefor. In unusual circumstances, the time limit prescribed in this section may be extended by written notice by the head of the agency or his or her designee to the person making the request, setting forth the reasons for the extension and the date on

which a determination is expected to be dispatched. No notice shall specify a date that would result in an extension for more than 14 days. When the agency dispatches the determination, and if the agency determines that the request seeks disclosable public records, the agency shall state the estimated date and time when the records will be made available. As used in this section, "unusual circumstances" means the following, but only to the extent reasonably necessary to the proper processing of the particular request:

- (1) The need to search for and collect the requested records from field facilities or other establishments that are separate from the office processing the request.
 - (2) The need to search for, collect, and appropriately examine a voluminous amount of separate and distinct records that are demanded in a single request.
 - (3) The need for consultation, which shall be conducted with all practicable speed, with another agency having substantial interest in the determination of the request or among two or more components of the agency having substantial subject matter interest therein.
 - (4) The need to compile data, to write programming language or a computer program, or to construct a computer report to extract data.
- (d) Nothing in this chapter shall be construed to permit an agency to delay or obstruct the inspection or copying of public records. The notification of denial of any request for records required by Section 6255 shall set forth the names and titles or positions of each person responsible for the denial.
- (e) Except as otherwise prohibited by law, a state or local agency may adopt requirements for itself that allow for faster, more efficient, or greater access to records than prescribed by the minimum standards set forth in this chapter.
- (f) In addition to maintaining public records for public inspection during the office hours of the public agency, a public agency may comply with subdivision (a) by posting any public record on its Internet Web site and, in response to a request for a public record posted on the Internet Web site, directing a member of the public to the location on the Internet Web site where the public record is posted. However, if after the public agency directs a member of the public to the Internet Web site, the member of the public requesting the public record requests a copy of the public record due to an inability to access or reproduce the public record from the Internet Web site, the public agency shall promptly provide a copy of the public record pursuant to subdivision (b).

Dear Task Force Members,

This letter responds to Sunshine Ordinance Complaint No 19111 filed by Mr. Michael Petrelis. Our office has worked diligently and in good faith to comply with the public records request made by Mr. Petrelis on October 7, 2019. We have provided timely responses and worked cooperatively with him to submit the records he has requested, and to date have provided him with many hundreds of pages of responsive documents.

Below is a detailed account of our communications with Mr. Petrelis and our efforts to accommodate his request.

- On October 7, 2019, Mr. Petrelis requested the immediate disclosure of all of Supervisor Mandelman's calendar items from January 1 through October 7, 2019, and all texts and emails, sent or received, from September 1 through October 7, 2019.
- On October 8, we responded to Mr. Petrelis' request informing him that, due to the voluminous and indiscriminate nature of the materials requested, we were unable to provide all responsive records immediately, but would respond further by October 21, 2019. The purpose of an immediate disclosure request is to expedite the City's response to a simple, routine, or otherwise readily answerable request. For more extensive or demanding requests, the maximum deadlines for responding to a request may apply (Admin. Code §67.25(a)).
- On October 9, in response to the previous communication, Mr. Petrelis responded that he was in receipt of our communication and that he requested the release of responsive records on a rolling basis. In accordance with Administrative Code, Sec. 67.25, public records may be provided as soon as reasonably possible on an incremental or rolling basis such that responsive records are produced as soon as possible by the end of the same business day that they are reviewed and collected.
- On October 15, we responded asking Mr. Petrelis asking whether there were any specific search criteria that he would like to apply with regards to emails due to the voluminous nature of emails received by the Supervisor, and our office's need to manually review communications for applicable redactions and withholdings of personal, personnel, or privileged information. We also noted to Mr. Petrelis that his

request for text messages raised a number of technical challenges regarding searching for and producing these records and that we would begin with emails and calendars.

- On October 16 and October 17, Mr. Petrelis provided a series of search terms.
- On October 23, in response to Mr. Petrelis' request that responsive records, including calendar entries, be provided on a rolling basis, we provided Mr. Petrelis with calendar entries from January-March 2019. These records totaled 100 pages. In this communication we noted that Mr. Petrelis' request was voluminous and required the careful review of calendar items and communications individually for applicable redactions to personal, privileged, and/or personnel information. We informed him that our office was prioritizing his request working diligently to process his requests, and would provide additional responsive records on a rolling basis as soon as they are reviewed and available.
- On October 30, in response to Mr. Petrelis' request that responsive records, including calendar entries, be provided on a rolling basis, we provided Mr. Petrelis with calendar entries from April-June 2019. These records totaled 155 pages. In this communication we again informed him that our office was prioritizing his request working diligently to process his requests, and would provide additional responsive records on a rolling basis as soon as they are reviewed and available.
- On October 31, Mr. Petrelis acknowledged receipt of the release of responsive records sent by our office on October 30.
- On November 12, Mr. Petrelis again acknowledged the receipt of the release of responsive records sent by our office on October 30 and noted that this was the "second batch of calendar entries" our office had submitted.
- On November 12, in response to Mr. Petrelis' request that responsive records, including calendar entries, be provided on a rolling basis, we provided Mr. Petrelis with calendar entries from July-October 7, 2019. These records totaled 134 pages. This completed Mr. Petrelis' request for all calendar items from January 1 through October 7, 2019. In this communication, we informed him that our office was prioritizing his request and would now be working diligently to process his requests for emails and text messages and would provide additional responsive records on a rolling basis as soon as they are reviewed and available.
- On November 19, in response to Mr. Petrelis' requests that responsive records, including emails sent and received, be provided on a rolling basis, we provided Mr. Petrelis with all emails sent or received from September 1 through October 7, 2019 that included his provided search terms. These records totaled 491 pages. This completed Mr. Petrelis request for all emails sent or received from September 1 through October 7, 2019 that included his provided search terms.

As demonstrated above, Mr. Petrelis' allegations of violations to the Sunshine Ordinance (Sec 67.21) are without basis and untrue; our office complied with his request and did so in good faith, with consultation with the Records and Projects Manager of the Board of Supervisors and

the City Attorney's office to ensure no violations were committed. To date, we have supplied Mr. Petrelis with 880 pages of responsive documents on a rolling basis per his request. Each of these documents require individual review by staff for applicable redactions or withholdings pursuant to CA Government Code 6254; Evidence Code sec. 952; Evidence Code sec. 954; Code of Civil Procedure 2018.030; Government Code 6254(c), Art. I, sec. 1; CA Const., Evidence Code sec. 1041; Evidence Code sec. 1040; Government Code sec. 6254(k); and/or Government Code sec. 6276.32.

Our communications with Mr. Petrelis, as well as the responsive records to his request that have been provided to date, are attached for your review.

Mr. Petrelis' request is expansive and burdensome – seeking thousands of pages of calendar entries, emails and text messages – and we have been working with Mr. Petrelis to release these records on a rolling basis and in a way that will allow the office to continue its routine functions in addition to processing this request. We will continue to work with Mr. Petrelis, as we have over the last six weeks, to complete the remainder of his request in a way that allows us to provide the records he seeks in good faith while minimizing the disruption to our office's public duties.

Mr. Petrelis' complaint is without merit and we request that the Task Force determine that our office has not committed any violation.

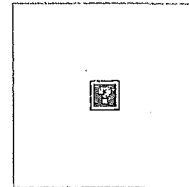

Hi Brad,

Thank you for your email; unfortunately, I receive dozens of emails like it every week, and I myself walk by scenes like that pretty much daily (as does pretty much every San Francisco resident right now). Every day my office works to assist residents looking for help with homelessness issues in their neighborhood. By far, these issues are the single biggest category of constituent issues we receive. I have monthly meetings with neighborhood leaders from the Castro/Upper Market, Duboce Triangle and Dolores Park areas, along with staff from the SFPD, Public Works, Department of Homelessness and Supportive Housing and Department of Public Health to assess the City's response to homeless issues in the District over the prior month and redirect resources as needed. I have weekly meetings with the Mayor's homelessness advisor to check in on various hot spots around the District as well as to review progress in moving the most disruptive individuals off the streets and into care. I worked through this year's budget process to secure funding for additional shelter beds and long-term housing and especially for additional placements for individuals suffering from a combination of mental illness and severe substance use disorder. I carried legislation to expand our local conservatorship programs to include mentally ill and substance-using people who are repeatedly being detained by police on 5150 holds but do not meet the traditional criteria for conservatorship. I urged the Mayor to appoint a Director of Mental Health Reform, to address the deficiencies across our public systems for responding to mental illness in the street population (which she did), and I urged the Mayor to establish a Meth Task Force to look for ways to improve the City's response to meth addiction, especially among our homeless population, which she also did and which I am co-chairing (recommendations should be out in October). That's some of what I have been up to on this issue. I do think it is worth noting that SF is not unique in experiencing increasing homelessness (and increasing street mental illness, alcoholism and substance use disorder); other cities across the region and up and down the West Coast are having similar experiences. That doesn't mean we can't and shouldn't do better, but it does mean some of this is beyond our ability to fix locally. I believe our situation is further complicated by the fact San Franciscans are incredibly divided on issues like conservatorship and enforcement. My sense is that most of my constituents would like more of both, but that sentiment is certainly not universally shared in the City or in City Hall. In the future I encourage you to cc Tom Temprano (my Chief of Staff, who among other things, helps me with homeless-related issues in the Castro, although the lucky guy is out of the office for another week on vacation) as well as Jessica Closson, the District 8 public safety liaison with the SFPD.

Not only did the city fail to address the needs of our homeless neighbors, it has also continued the inhumane and ineffective homeless sweeps throughout the city. Digging my way through the email backlog, I came upon your message below. Apologies for the slow response. In the future I encourage you to cc Tom Temprano (my Chief of Staff, who among other things, helps me with homeless-related issues in Duboce Park and the Castro) as well as Jessica Closson, the District 8 public safety liaison with the SFPD. Every day my office works to assist residents looking for help with homelessness issues in their neighborhood. By far, these issues are the single biggest category of constituent issues we receive. I have monthly meetings with neighborhood leaders from the Castro/Upper Market, Duboce Triangle and Dolores Park areas, along with staff from the SFPD, Public Works, Department of Homelessness and Supportive Housing and Department of Public Health to assess the City's response to homeless issues in the District over the prior month and redirect resources as needed. I have weekly meetings with the Mayor's homelessness advisor to check in on various hot spots around the District as well as to review progress in moving the most disruptive individuals off the streets and into care. I carried legislation to expand our local conservatorship programs to include mentally ill and substance-using people who are repeatedly being detained by police on 5150 holds but do not meet the traditional criteria for conservatorship. I urged the Mayor to appoint a Director of Mental Health Reform, to address the deficiencies across our public systems for responding to mental illness in the street population (which she did), and I urged the Mayor to establish a Meth Task Force to look for ways to improve the City's response to meth addiction, especially among our homeless population, which she also did and which I am co-chairing (recommendations should be out in October). That's some of what I have been up to on this issue. I do think it is worth noting that SF is not unique in experiencing increasing homelessness (and increasing street mental illness, alcoholism and substance use disorder); other cities across the region and up and down the West Coast are having similar experiences. I believe our situation is further complicated by the fact San Franciscans are incredibly divided on issues like conservatorship and enforcement. Please provide a list of bills which have been proposed or authorized by Rafael regarding resolving the homeless crisis which is clearly getting worse in District 8. I'd like to understand what is his plan, what actions he has taken, and what is the timeline. How does he measure success?

I currently reside in Duboce Triangle and I can definitely see the problem is getting worse, not better, since Rafael has been in office. What I am seeing/experiencing is:

- Human waste on the street and subsequent calls to 311 indicating the city has up to three days to respond to clean it up.
- Car break-in where needles with blood are left on my front seat.
- Mentally ill individuals roaming the streets at night yelling at the top of their lungs at 4:00 and 5:00AM various profanities, which is sustained for a half hour minimum
- Continuous encampments where 311 indicates the city has up to three days to respond, the individuals move a block down, the city indicates it is now a new report and they have another three days to respond.

I see the situation deteriorating and would like to know what ACTIONS, not talk, Rafael is taking.

There are two subjects that are raised frequently in conversations in my neighborhood.

The first is how many of our neighbors and friends have packed up and left the city they love because it is no longer recognizable. It is a different city with a misguided idea of what its residents should expect to put up with in the name of tolerance. It is a city where it's acceptable to shoot up on the sidewalk opposite a school. It's a city where your children dodge shattered auto glass on the sidewalk one morning, human excrement the next, detritus from a homeless encampment the morning after that. Where mail is stolen from your mailbox, packages from your stoop, bicycles from your closed, locked garage. It is a city where you cross the street to avoid the aggressive behavior of a mentally ill individual, only to cross back again to avoid the behavior of another. It is the kind of city where during your journey, you lock your car doors. Where the distant sound of firecrackers makes you think of guns before fireworks. And where the inexcusable inaction of elected officials has translated to a boon for iron workers who erect bars over building entrances.

Which brings me to the second subject often raised by my determined and motivated neighbors in our area of District 8. It's a date: November 8, 2022.

The Department of Public Health (DPH) will request approval for one item at the September 24th Budget & Finance Committee meeting. Please see below for a brief description of the item, as well as the corresponding representatives, whom you may contact directly should you have any additional questions.

Agenda Item #5: File No. 190930 - Apply for Grant - California Department of Health Care Services - Housing Funds for Whole Person Care Pilot Program - Not to Exceed \$8,130,059

- DPH requests approval to apply for one-time Housing Funds for Whole Person Care pilot program from the California Department of Health Care Services (DHCS) in an amount not to exceed \$8,130,059 from January 1, 2020, through June 30, 2025; and to designate the Department of Homelessness and Supportive Housing (HSH) as the single point of contact for the Housing Funds for Whole Person Care (WPC) pilot allocation. This funding is available for the costs of long-term and short-term housing, such as hotel vouchers and rental subsidies, as well as capital investment for housing projects for Medi-Cal beneficiaries who are mentally ill and are experiencing homelessness, or are at risk of homelessness.
- The WPC Pilot program coordinates health, behavioral health and social services in a patient-centered manner with the goal of improved beneficiary health and well-being. Many of these pilot programs target individuals who are mentally ill and are experiencing homelessness or who are at risk of homelessness, and have a demonstrated medical need for housing and/or supportive services. Since DPH serves as the WPC Pilot Program Lead Entity for San Francisco, DHCS requires that DPH apply for and initially receive the funding allocation. However, given that HSH coordinates housing and supporting services for the City, DPH will transfer these funds to HSH and designate HSH to serve as the primary contact for the allocation.
- HSH and DPH are working in partnership to determine how to best utilize this funding, and intends to provide additional projects details when it returns to this Committee for the accept and expend process.

I was stunned to learn any SFGH Mental Health beds were intentionally left empty. Few city agencies have my trust. Even though I'm sure there's a more nuanced story here...the inability for the agencies to be transparent and work together is more than disheartening. While I try to be part of a solution, every day I'm tempted to join the ranks and move away...

The facts are - everyone is in a 'no win' situation and are hurt when mentally ill and/or addicted are wandering the streets. And those who are functioning, but *merely* homeless also can't qualify for adequate housing.

The report from the SF Budget Analyst office - showing how various conservatorships in SF compare to other CA cities, implies we're wasting \$\$ in very short term (5150 /72 hr) psychiatric holds vs longer term services. I'm hoping the findings lead to better coordination and management in SF.

I don't usually forward the MissionLocal articles (I mistrust their journalistic 'standards'), but this article coupled with the supervisors responses indicates that to the shuttering of the SFGH beds isn't the solution.

How do correct all the agency disfunction? I just want to lock DPH, HSH, SFPD, SFFD, all the Supes and you in a room...no food or rest until you figure out how to work together on the problems. Understand that how it currently 'works', isn't.

Nonetheless, I have very specific questions about the very troubling commercial vacancies problem in the Castro that I hope you will address at this meeting and in other meetings and communications with your constituents.

In one Hoodline article, you urged a "Marshall Plan" (and note possible ideas and outreach to agencies). See <https://hoodline.com/2019/08/after-10-years-high-end-clothing-retailer-unionmade-closes-both-castro-stores> The article specifically states:

" Hoodline reached out to District 8 Supervisor Rafael Mandelman to

discuss the Castro's recent retail closures. He acknowledged the Castro retail situation is critical, with each business' closure reflecting a different tale to be told. Mandelman is currently working on planning code changes to help new businesses open. He also plans to work with the San Francisco's Office of Economic and Workforce Development to find strategies to help existing Castro businesses. "The situation is dire," said Mandelman. "The Castro needs a Marshall Plan."

The issue of vacancies has come to the forefront in the past month, with restaurants Beso, Chow, and Firewood Cafe; clothing store Outfit; and longtime repair shop EV's Repair Service all closing their doors. Floral shop Ixia, a legacy business, announced last week that it will be moving out of the neighborhood soon. While Masood Samereie, president of Castro Merchants, said the recent closures were unfortunate, he believes their timing "was a coincidence."

"His background in real estate has given him intimate knowledge of landlords, and for most, he said, "their main goal is to make money, not to lose money. The longer they have it vacant, the worse it is for them." But he also acknowledged that some property owners keep their spaces vacant as a tax write-off. He believes that Supervisor Sandra Lee Fewer's new legislation requiring vacant storefronts to be registered will help, and he's also a supporter of Supervisor Aaron Peskin's vacancy tax proposal. "It could possibly entice some property owners to think more seriously about keeping [spaces] vacant," said Samereie."

Please note: One of the comments this second article specifically contrasts the Castro with other nearby areas, like Hayes and Divisadero which are "bustling corridors with few vacancies." The commenter offers his own theory: "The Castro and the Upper Haight are overwhelmed with homeless people and bad street behavior, so no one wants to shop there and stores are closing. Nearby Hayes and Divisadero have little homeless people and they have bustling corridors with few vacancies. This isn't rocket science."

Clearly, other residents and I would like you to address the dire commercial vacancies situation and create a specific gameplan to deal with it. We very much look forward to hearing from you on this critical commercial vacancy issues (including the obvious contrast with the bustling Hayes and Divasadero districts).

Mayor London Breed,

I am becoming increasingly concerned regarding the gun violence in and around Dolores Park. A little less than a year ago there was a shooting on the bridge at 19th and Church during daylight at 3:30 pm. That was the second shooting at that location in the past two years. Both times, there was an increase in police presence for a couple weeks, and then back to normal. As someone who lives near Dolores Park, I'm always surprised by the lack of police presence at one of San Francisco's busiest parks. I cannot understand why there isn't a dedicated team consistently present in and around the area.

It's unfortunately not surprising to me that there was yet another shooting in daylight at 4:30 pm at 18th and Church on September 13th, just a mere 30 minutes after I was there walking my children home from school. There are 5 schools within a few blocks of Dolores Park (Everett Middle school, Sanchez Elementary, Dolores Academy, Children's Day School and Mission High School). I fear that one day my children or someone else's children will be in the wrong place at the wrong time.

The city needs to do more to make this neighborhood a safer place for the children who go to school and the residents that live near Dolores Park. This could easily be achieved by round-the-clock or at least mid-afternoon through evening police presence and patrol.

Dear Supervisor Mandelman,

I am concerned that the quality of life in this city is going downhill, and fast. I live in Noe Valley. I have found homeless people sleeping on my doorstep and in front of my garage, human feces on my sidewalk, drunks and mentally ill people fighting and yelling on the sidewalk outside my home day and night. I have sometimes been afraid to walk on the sidewalks around my home due to the number of mentally ill, some of them hostile. My brother's car was broken into and stolen outside my house. It took 2 days but I actually found it myself by driving around (the police didn't have enough personnel to look.) Cars regularly race past my house at high speeds and don't stop at the stop sign because there is no traffic enforcement and it's now the norm not to come to a full stop. 2 men brandishing guns from their car were stopped by the police on the corner just outside my house last month. Last month I saw the police on the roof of my neighbor's house searching for a thief. Large trucks, in the range of "big rig" size regularly drive past my home and around my neighborhood at all hours of the day and night with loud diesel engines waking me up and generally causing me to feel like I live next to a highway rather than the residential area I've lived in for over 25 years. Large trucks and their frequency was relatively rare until the last 5 years. Apparently there isn't any enforcement or restrictions on size and time of day for such vehicles. Car drivers, bicyclist, scooter drivers consistently don't seem to want to obey traffic laws and cause hazards. The streets of the city are noisy due to truck traffic and the sidewalks are filthy with trash strewn about somewhere on nearly every sidewalk despite regular DPW cleaning. People dig through and steal my recyclables every week and leave a mess. People dump mattresses and other trash on my sidewalk every week that I clean up myself or call the city for pick up. It makes being a pedestrian unpleasant, although I know the city is working to reduce car trips in favor of pedestrian trips.

Can you please let me know how your office is addressing any of these problems? I am concerned that you may not be aware of the impact these cumulative problems have on the quality of life of people who live here are experiencing. There are many things I love about this city but day to day life on the streets around my home and the city in general is more and more unpleasant. it should not be ignored.

I am one of your constituents living in the Castro. I reached out to your office this morning and would like to set up a meeting or call with you to discuss what efforts are being taken to solve the homeless issue in District 8. Simply put, the current situation is untenable. Daily in the Castro there are homeless people defecating in the street, leaving trash everywhere and openly using drugs. My wife and I have to call SFPD or 311 on almost a daily basis and when I talk to SFPD officers they consistently say that City Hall does not care about this issue and is not giving them the resources for something as simple as beat cops to regularly patrol the area. Despite tent cities now being illegal by ordinance, it takes daily calls to 311 from multiple people in our neighborhood for any action to occur on the part of the city. Even then, the exact same tents pop up a week later. Just last night we had a homeless person buzzing all the units in our building trying to get inside. The city is spending hundreds of millions of dollars on homelessness and through the ill-conceived Prop C now my wife's company may end up moving out of the city. As a citizen I demand action. It is time for you and City Hall to find a better way. Homelessness is not due to high housing prices, it is due to mental illness and substance abuse and it is time to start institutionalizing those that are a persistent blight on our beautiful city. Dear Rafael and Erin, It was a pleasure speaking with you both yesterday at the Diamond Heights Fire Mitigation meeting! Thank you for the valuable advice provided at the meeting, which I think everyone thought was very successful. And, you're right, Betsy Eddy is a dynamo! We are lucky to have her in our district. I've also copied our GPNHP Assistant Project Director, Amy O'Hair, on this email. I wanted to follow up with both of you about the proposed Glen Canyon Park History Promenade. As Rafael already knows, this is a proposal that former Supervisor Sheehy had stated he would advocate for under the Add-Back segment of the 2018-2019 Participatory Budget, and which Rafael has also expressed interest in supporting. I would enjoy meeting with you at Glen Canyon Park and provide an overview of the project that would provide a chronological timeline of the significant histories in Glen Canyon along the entryway from Elk Street to the Recreation Center. For an overview, I've attached our December 2017 submission to the District 8 Participatory Budget for background (unfortunately, our application was lost following submission and was never voted on by the community). I'd be happy to lead you on a history walk in Glen Canyon Park. It would take one hour, and we can do it early morning (say 8 am) or at lunch (noon). I usually work at home on Wednesdays and Fridays, or I'm happy to do a weekend day, if that's easier for both of you. Also, as I mentioned, I'm going to be on vacation until the end of October and, other than Friday, October 19 through Sunday, October 21, we should be available most Wednesdays or Fridays.
