2	Resolution urging the Mayor and the Board of Supervisors to officially support and formally
3	commend President Obama's Summer Jobs+ plan and to develop a similar plan for the youth
4	of San Francisco
5	
6	WHEREAS, President Obama announced a new plan, Summer Jobs+, to address the critical
7	need for youth employment in the United States; and
8	WHEREAS, this initiative is a public private partnership committing to create 180,000 jobs and
9	internships for low-income youth ages 16-24, in summer 2012 (with the goal of 250,000), and
10	WHEREAS, the central feature of this plan is the Summer + Job Bank, which will have youth
11	employment listings similarly to the Veterans Job Bank; and
12	WHEREAS, summer jobs have historically been an opportunity for youth to develop crucial job
13	skills, earn money for college, and provide a responsible and rewarding pastime when school is not in
14	session; and
15	WHEREAS, only 48.8% of youth this July were employed, the lowest July record since the
16	Bureau of Labor Statistics began this record in 1948; ¹ and
17	WHEREAS, these July employment figures have dropped significantly from 59.2% five years
18	ago and 63.3% ten years ago; and
19	WHEREAS, youth summer unemployment disproportionately affects minority youth, with just
20	34.6% of African American and 42.9% of Hispanic working this July; and
21	WHEREAS, all things being equal, year spent unemployed under the age of 23 will reduce a
22	young man's earnings even 10 years later by 23%, a young woman's by 16% (The Economist), and ²

5	similar plan for the youth of San Francisco, as to spark a strong work ethic in San Francisco's young
6	people, while setting up the city and county for a successful future.
