9	WHEREAS, The Bayview has a great amount of toxicity and litter that negatively affect the city
10	environmentally and financially and are issues not solely caused by young people; ¹ and
11	WHEREAS, While 61% of California jobs require a college credential, only 27% of San
12	Francisco Unified School district 9 th grade students are on track to graduate with A-G requirements—
13	and less than 10% of African-American and Latino students; ² and
14	WHEREAS, Suicide is the third leading cause of death among teenagers, and bullying victims
15	are 2-9 times more likely to consider suicide than non-bullying victims, and 160,000 students stay
16	home from school for fear of being bullied; ³ and
17	WHEREAS, Mentoring has many positive effects, including decreasing the chances of youth
18	using illegal drugs improving academic performance ⁴ —and improving the mentor's life, too; and
19	WHEREAS, Violence harms young people in many San Francisco communities, especially in
20	the Bayview; ⁵ and
